Dear Folks,

I tell folks that I have miraculous hands. Yep, because Jesus uses my hands to turn bread into Him. But that is not what I am talking about,

I am talking about the pandemic washing of my hands and rubbing them down with alcohol. My hands should be dried and cracking, but instead they are in better shape than ever! So if you ever need evidence for my canonization, check and see if this miracle holds up. (And in case you can't tell, I am toooooootaly joking, I don't have delusions of canonization)!

But more seriously, all this washing of hands, and how much more habitual it has become, has reminded me of a note that I put in the bulletin regarding allergies. Also some foods I have found in church brought to mind that it is important to repeat this again.

Allergies, Allergies:

Allergies have become a very serious issue in our parish. We have parish families who can never go to events in our Parish Life Center (COVID regulations are lifting and soon we can begin again) because there are nuts around and about. Families who must bring to Mass several EpiPens for their children on the possibility that another family was feeding a toddler a PBJ sandwich. And yes, we have seen children eating PBJs and then wiping hands over pews.

I strive to make this parish as family friendly as possible. Children are the supreme gift of marriage, and the treasure of our parish. I hope you notice how welcome they are in our Masses. I understand that parenting is difficult, and that parents often resort to feeding children in Mass. However, the Church is not the place for feeding children. Know that your feeding your child peanut butter, can put the life of another child at risk who sits in that pew at a later Mass. Nuts are also similarly problematic. We cannot make the church an absolutely 'nut free zone.' That is impossible to guarantee. However, if we absolutely must feed while at Mass, consider doing so in the vestibule, and be considerate by avoiding more common allergens. This is a simple act of charity for your brother and sisters in Christ. Their children's lives may depend on

Parking at St Mary

St Mary is blessed to be located in a great spot here in the College Heights neighborhood in downtown Fredericksburg. Being located in a neighborhood gives us special obligations to be good neighbors to the residents who live around the church. One way we can contribute to being good neighbors is by how we park for Mass. As you all know, we have a parking lot that is often too small for our church, often necessitating parking in the neighborhood to attend Mass. St Mary wishes to encourage our parishioners as much as possible to be mindful of the neighbors in front of whose houses we park, and one way of doing that is to first try and park on the new parking spots added on William Street in the past year. This street parking provides direct access to the parish property with little to no inconvenience to our neighbors. We encourage anyone coming from downtown up William Street to use those spots first before attempting to park anywhere else. One other way to make the parking situation better is to park in a way that will allow a maximum number of cars to fit on the street. On Sunday mornings, some of our neighbors have to park 2 or 3 blocks from their house because of our overflow onto the neighborhood streets. Please park considerately. And lastly, when exiting the parking lot on the Stafford Avenue Exit, please be cautious and mindful of the fact that we are exiting into a neighborhood. These small considerate steps can help to alleviate a great stress on our neighbors, and make Sunday Mass a little more prayerful and a little less hectic once we leave the church for the chaos of the world.

Catechesis Within the Family

"While the catechesis offered within the family is ordinarily informal, unstructured, and spontaneous, it is no less crucial for the development of the child's faith. In a certain sense nothing replaces family catechesis, especially for its positive and receptive environment, for the example of adults, and for its first explicit experience and practice of the faith. The catechesis of infants and young children nourishes the beginnings of the life of faith. Parents have shared the gift of human life with their children and, through Baptism, have enriched them with a share in God's own life. They have the duty to nourish it. Their faith, their attitude toward other human beings, and their trust in a loving God strongly influence the development of the child's faith. Parents are catechists precisely because they are parents. Their role in the formation of Christian values in their children is irreplaceable. They should speak naturally and simply about God and their faith, as they do about other matters they want their children to understand and appreciate.

Parents are also the most effective catechists of prayer for their young children. They know what their children are capable of understanding and can easily teach their children basic prayers and the fundamental attitude of prayer. By praying frequently with their children at special moments during the day and especially by praying with them at the Sunday Eucharist, parents introduce children into the prayer life of the Church. By incorporating prayer into everyday family experiences, parents teach their children by example. Their witness encourages their children to call upon God as their Father who loves and protects them; to look to Jesus, their Savior and brother, who leads them to the Father; and to acknowledge the presence of the Holy Spirit, who dwells within their hearts."

Children's Offertory Envelopes for July

All Children's Charity donations for the month of August will be donated to Leashes of Valor, a national nonprofit working to provide a highly trained service dog to every post-9/11 Veteran who needs one to ease the symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) or Military Sexual Trauma (MST), an underlying trauma to PTSD. Their mission is as simple as it is critical: bring service dogs and post-9/11 Veterans together to enrich the lives of both. Leashes of Valor was founded in May 2017 by three United States Military Veterans with over 40 years of combined service and expertise in service dog policy and law, military canines and canine training, who know the healing power of canines because they experienced it themselves. The facility is located on a 20-acre farm in rural Virginia, with a live-in facility for training veteran and service dog teams. Training a service dog costs \$25,000.00 per dog, but thanks to the generosity of donors,

veterans who receive a Leashes of Valor service dog pay nothing. For more information, visit their website at **leashesofvalor.org**.
