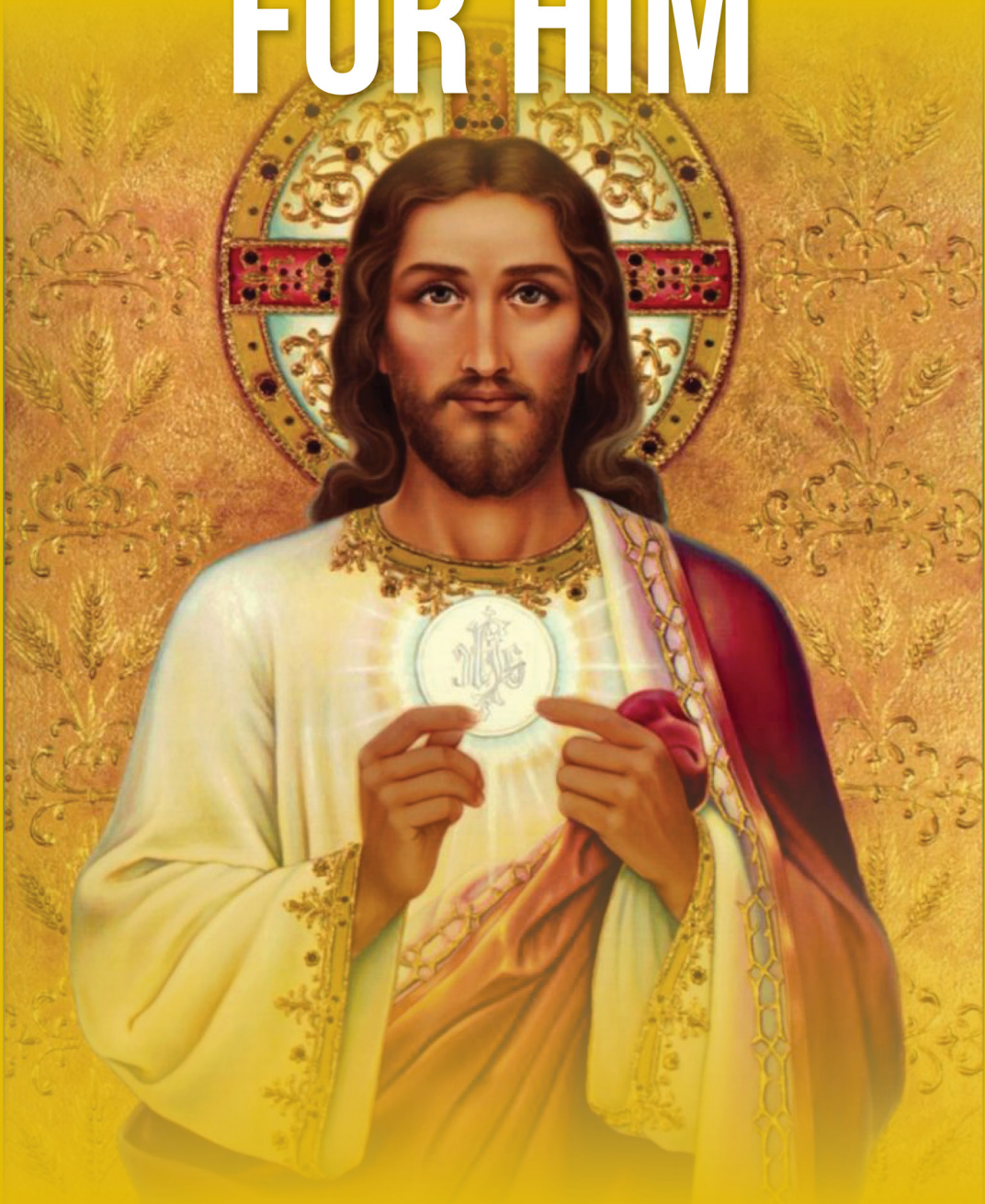

September Recap at HCA Preschool

September was such a busy and fun month in preschool. Apples were a big part of our month as students played apple orchard, explored their five senses with taste tests, cooking activities, art projects, and science experiments. Speaking of our five senses, Fr. Koehr began a series of lessons focusing on how we use senses at Mass. Our first lesson explored the wonderful smell of incense and how the smoke from the thurible rises up, just like our prayers to heaven! Our three year old classes have also been focusing on how special their names are, how awesome it is that God made everything, how to be a good classmate, and they are really working hard to master our daily prayers and the Sign of the Cross. Our four year olds have been learning about creation, Adam and Eve, and the first five letters of the alphabet. 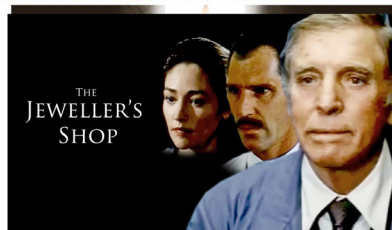

Cana Family Group NEW Ministry!

Cana Group is a Catholic Family Ministry creating intentional Christian communities primarily for young families in their first 10 years of marriage. The small groups of no more than 7 families primarily minister to each other through Marriage, Faith, Family, Spiritual Growth, and Community Building to enrich ourselves, our marriages, and our children to grow in holiness and faithfulness. The Cana Group which includes the entire family of couples and children meets formally once a month for dinner, fellowship, and discussion. Our family style dinner is hosted at a home with each family bringing something to contribute to the meal. After the meal the children are led by high schoolers who provide activities and games with a Catholic Theme while the adults gather separately for discussion led by one of the participating couples about a relevant topic for Catholic families.

Outside of the formal gatherings, the entire community is bonded by the informal gatherings between community members every day. This could include playdates for children, double date nights for couples, service projects that the whole family can participate in, attending daily mass together, Kings Dominion trips together, picnics, helping each other out in times of need, etc.. We truly strive to be a community of faithful supporting each other as we start marriages and families.

concerts at st mary

On Friday, October 22, 2021 at 8pm, Concerts at Saint Mary welcomes the trumpet/organ duo of Chuck Seipp and Randall Sheets, who will perform a program to open the 2021/2022 concert season.

Trumpeter Chuck Seipp and organist Randall Sheets are two performers at the top of their craft. As the Seipp/Sheets Duo, their programs feature a diverse array of classical, virtuoso, lyrical, humorous and patriotic works. The duo's performances also include audience participation and video presentations, ranging from interactive videos, to patriotic imagery, to silent film. Both are high-profile musicians in their own right. Dr. Sheets is ceremonial organist for Arlington National Cemetery, and Dr. Seipp is a Shenandoah Conservatory professor and Sergeant Major (retired) from The United States Army Band, "Pershing's Own." Their reputation for excellence as a duo has grown during the past four seasons, as they

have performed more than 50 concerts in 20 states (including Piccolo Spoleto L'Organo, Washington National Cathedral, The Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land, and West Point Cadet Chapel) and produced three recordings. In addition to standard repertoire and arrangements of their own, the Seipp/Sheets Duo regularly commissions new arrangements and compositions.

The program performed by the fantastic duo will include many original arrangements for trumpet and organ of well-known works including Bach's Toccata and Fugue in D minor, Mussorgsky's Pictures at an Exhibition, and Bohemian Rhapsody by Freddie Mercury to name a few. As with all Concert at Saint Mary events, the concert is free and open to the public. Mark your calendars for an evening that promises to be enjoyable and entertaining.

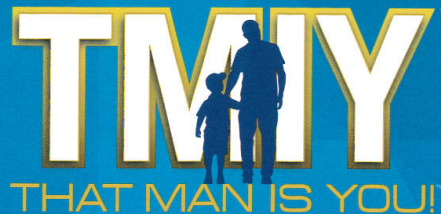

World Mission Sunday

October 23 & 24

"We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard"

Every year something special happens on the next to last Sunday of October – World Mission Sunday joins all Catholics of the world into one community of faith. At Mass that Sunday, we recommit ourselves to our common vocation, through Baptism, to be missionaries through prayer, participation in the Eucharist and by giving generously to the World Mission Sunday collection.

Pope Francis' message for World Mission Sunday this year reflects on the theme "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20). He reminds us that "as Christians, we cannot keep the Lord to ourselves," as we "recall with gratitude all those men and

women who by their testimony of life help us to renew our baptismal commitment to be generous and joyful apostles of the Gospel." Pope Francis invites the entire Church to support mission dioceses in Africa, Asia, the Pacific Islands and parts of Latin America and Europe where priests, religious and lay leaders serve the world's most vulnerable communities. In a world where so much divides us, World Mission Sunday rejoices in our unity as missionaries by our Baptism, as it offers each of us an opportunity to support the life-giving presence of the Church among the poor and marginalized in more than 1,111 mission dioceses.

Your prayers and generous support offered on World Mission Sunday extends your merciful witness to the whole world, and is deeply appreciated.

Children's Offertory Envelopes for October

The children's charity that will benefit from Children's Offertory Envelopes in October is Safe Harbor Child Advocacy Center in Spotylvania. This organization strives to strengthen the coordinated community response to situations of child maltreatment, including sexual abuse, severe physical abuse, severe neglect and fatalities, by integrating the existing resources of law enforcement, child protection, prosecution, medical and therapeutic agencies so that perpetrators are held accountable for their actions and children are not further traumatized by the investigative process. Children's Offertory Envelopes are available through Religious Education. All proceeds from these envelopes go to a different children's charity each month.
