





These are Virginia grown (Mt. Rogers), freshly cut premium Fraser Firs with beautiful long-lasting soft needles and that great memorable evergreen smell.



TO THE HOLY FAMILY

Families today face many struggles, both through cultural pressure and through the personal struggles that accompany family life. Despite these struggles — and partly as a result of conquering them — families have great capacity for love and joy, a joy that is strengthened through the peace and truth found in Christ. To assist families in living out this joy of Christ, Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori has composed a prayer through which families may come together to consecrate themselves under the protection of the Holy Family. We invite every family of our parish to engage in the Consecration to the Holy Family on December 26th at 10:30am Mass at Holy Cross Academy

#### Four suggested steps before praying the Consecration to the Holy Family:

- **1.** Discuss the importance of this consecration as a family and why you are doing it.
- **2.** Each member of your family is strongly encouraged to receive the sacrament of reconciliation.
- **3.** As a family, intentionally choose something to fast from. The fast can be for at least a week. As our physical bodies are drawn to things of the world, it is strongly encouraged that you fast from something that you would normally do or consume. Fasting Helps to discipline our minds and hearts to refrain from secular activities and be more focused on God.
- **4.** Prepare for the commitment you are making. Consecration to the Holy Family is not a single event. You have chosen a way of life for your family. You and your family are consciously choosing to be a beacon of light of God's love through his Church.

# our parish ministry highlight

#### **Prison Ministry**

#### A Poverty of Hope.

In today's unbalanced and imperfect world, we see evidence of poverty and hopelessness in many forms. But, there is a place that we often fail to see where a poverty of hope abounds. The objective of the Jail/Prison Ministry is to deliver faith, hope, encouragement, compassion, friendship, and dignity to our incarcerated brothers and sisters.

Through the grace of the Holy Spirit, we serve to offer inmates the chance to change the direction of their lives. We have two different letter writing programs, within which anonymity is strictly maintained. Team members can choose to be part of one or the other or both, based on their personal discernment.



#### Pen Pal Program

Team members are assigned an inmate who has requested to exchange letters with someone on the outside. We remind our pen pals that God has neither left them nor forsaken them and that He never stops loving us nor gives up on us. It is never too late to change the direction of our life.

#### **Death Row Mercy Program**

Team members send unsolicited letters to inmates on death row or have life sentences. We strive to lead those whose lives have been condemned to seek forgiveness and salvation while there is still time. Remember Dismas, "The Good Thief", who was with our Lord on Mt. Calvary.

I started this ministry 4 years ago after witnessing the trials and tribulations of a close friend, as well as a close family member, both who spent time in prison. And though each had a wonderful life to return to, this is often not the case for many inmates who have been incarcerated for a long period of time and who still have many years before their release. It's common for such inmates to have lost contact with their families and friends; have little or no spiritual or emotional guidance; and have lost all hope for a life free from their past.

As a corporal work of mercy, Matthew 25:36, 40 says "I was in prison and you came to visit me ... I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me." I've been drawn to this apostolic calling with heartfelt fulfillment that through the grace of the Holy Spirit we have the opportunity to change the life of a lost soul. It's hard for me to imagine a greater reward than that of leading at least one lost sheep back to our Shepard.
