

## Sacrament of Penance: Going to Confession

- The Sign of the Cross": **"IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER AND OF THE SON AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN! Continue with these words: "BLESS ME, FATHER, FOR I HAVE SINNED; IT HAS BEEN \_\_\_\_\_ SINCE MY LAST CONFESSION AND THESE ARE MY SINS."** Tell the priest the sins you identified in your examination of conscience.
- When you have confessed your sins, say: **"FOR THESE AND ALL OF MY SINS, I AM SORRY."**
- Listen to what the priest tells you. He may ask you questions or give you some good advice.
- Then the priest will give you your penance.
- The priest will ask you to pray the "The Act of Contrition." You pray: **"O MY GOD, I AM HEARTILY SORRY FOR HAVING OFFENDED YOU. I DETEST ALL MY SINS BECAUSE OF YOUR JUST PUNISHMENTS, BUT MOST OF ALL BECAUSE THEY OFFEND YOU MY GOD, WHO ARE ALL GOOD AND DESERVING OF ALL MY LOVE. I FIRMLY RESOLVE, WITH THE HELP OF YOUR GRACE, TO CONFESS MY SINS, TO DO MY PENANCE AND AMEND MY LIFE. AMEN."**
- The priest will pray "The Prayer of Absolution" (which is a sign of God's forgiveness), at the end of the prayer the priest will bless you and you make "The Sign of the Cross": **"IN THE NAME OF THE FATHER AND OF THE SON AND OF THE HOLY SPIRIT. AMEN! Thank the priest and leave the confessional.**
- Go kneel and quietly do your penance.



## What is the Holy Cross Academy Scrip Program?

We have a program at HCA called the Scrip program. The HCA Scrip program is a year-round fund raiser that directly supports Holy Cross Academy. Funds raised over the years have supported purchasing new books, assisted with tuition aid, and operating expenses. Participating in Scrip is easy. Just purchase gift cards from a scrip volunteer or online and then shop at your favorite store. By doing this you raise fund without it costing you anything extra. We carry cards for Giant, Weis, Walmart, Target, Wawa, Sheetz, Outback, Olive Garden, Red Lobster, just to name a few. A complete list of cards we carry in inventory can be found on the HCA website. On the Shop with Scrip website ([ShopWithScrip.com](http://ShopWithScrip.com)) there is a link to the full retailer list. This list contains over 750 retailers from which we can order cards. If you order a card by Monday, it will be delivered by Friday. We sell scrip at HCA on Wednesday and Thursday pm carpool. We also sell scrip after most masses at St Mary (except 7:00 Saturday, 2:30pm Sunday and 7:00 Sunday). To sell after those masses, we need more volunteers to sell Scrip. Visit the scrip volunteer at the scrip table to purchase Scrip gift cards, to volunteer, or if you have a question. We take cash or checks at the Scrip table. But if you set up an account online at ShopWithScrip, you may pay with PrestoPay or you can pay with your credit card (Visa or Mastercard). We have approximately 30 families purchasing Scrip on a weekly basis. We would like to increase the level of participation to allow us to raise more funds for HCA. If a desired date is no longer available, you are welcome to request an intention that is "unscheduled," and one of the priests will gladly celebrate Mass for your intention at an extra Mass during the week or as a concelebrant.*
