

from our pastor pax et bonum

Dear Folks,

Please read carefully: No priest will ever ask you to text or email him gift cards. Never, ever. Not in a million years.

Thieves pretending to be your pastor and asking you to buy gift cards is a rampant scam. I first saw this happen four years ago, but now it has become a weekly and even daily scam. Every week some members of St. Mary's get an email(s) or texts claiming to be from me asking for a favor. When you respond, you get a message about how busy I am but need gift cards for people in the hospital.

These emails and texts are never, ever from me. If you look closely at the address it comes from, it is not my email, or my phone number. Sometimes they create a fake gmail account with one letter off from mine. Other times they are lazy and use a generic email. Other times they text. Google and Apple can't seem to stop this and they will not refund any of the money stolen from you. The FBI is aware, but these are not coming from the anywhere in this country and the nature of the internet is making it impossible to stop.

If you send gift cards to the scammers they are redeemed immediately and the money sold on the black market. It is robbery, plain and simple. Parishioners have been robbed of anywhere from \$300 to more than \$1000.

So please remember:

- No priest of this or any parish will ever ask you to email/text gift cards codes or cash or banking info.
- Never feel pressured to give by phone, email or text. If you're ever unsure, it's safest to end the conversation and call the parish directly.
- Never pay over the phone and never send payment information via text or email.
- Be wary of false urgency. Scammers may try to create a sense of urgency to persuade you to do what they're asking immediately.
- You do not have to answer people who are trying to scam you. Pray for them, but don't respond.
- Trust Faith direct, this is the only company we use for electronic donations.

I hope that helps, and I pray that everyone in the parish is aware of this blight! I'll say a Hail Mary for these scammers: may the Blessed Mother break their internet and get them real jobs. :-)

When Saint Mary's collects gift cards for the needy, it is done very differently, with you dropping off physical cards at the parish office or in the collection basket. That way you can be sure that your gifts are actually going to folks in need.

Growing Up Religious

Robert Wuthnow in his book, "Growing Up Religious" outlines several family routines and daily habits of 'religious' people. These include Family Meals—eating together, saying grace before meals and discussing life; bedtime rituals and prayer; talks of values, character, and holiness; having sacred objects/religious images in the home; celebrating Holy Days of Obligation and holidays; moral instruction; being part of a faith community; family devotions and reading of the Bible and involving relatives and grandparents in family life.

During this summer break families are encouraged to practice the family routines and daily habits listed above. FORMED, HOLY HEROES and EWTN are excellent Catholic resources for families.

First Holy Communion 2022

On Saturday, May 6, two First Holy Communion liturgies were celebrated for Holy Cross Academy and Religious Education students. Another for more Religious Education students will be held at noon on Saturday, May 13.

"As Catholics, we know that the Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith: it is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Pope Francis has called it the "Sacrament of Love":

"The Eucharist is at the heart of 'Christian initiation', together with Baptism and Confirmation, and it constitutes the source of the Church's life itself. From this Sacrament of love, in fact, flows every authentic journey of faith, of communion, and of witness." For children who are preparing to receive their First Holy Communion, this is a big deal. And for all of us, no matter how many times we have received Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist, it should always be a big deal.

What makes it so special the first time is the same thing that makes it special every time!

Jesus comes to us in a unique way in the Eucharist. When He comes, we receive Him into our body and our soul. This is very beautiful, personal, and intimate. We should not take it for granted!






