

Dear Folks,

Thanks sooooo mucho!!!

I type this the day after my 25th Anniversary Mass and party around the parish. Last we had 100 second graders in Religious Education, this year we had only 40 third graders. A child who leaves school after second grade and returns in seventh grade is poorly educated.





July 13 The Footprints of God series by Stephen Ray---Mary: The Mother of God





Seven Sisters Apostolate!

The Seven Sisters Apostolate is a worldwide mission of prayer for priests and bishops, formed to intercede for the needs and intentions of priests and bishops, supporting them in their vocation and ministry. Currently St. Mary supports 12 teams, five for our own priests, one for the bishop, and six more for other priests of our diocese who are in need of prayer warriors!

Each team consists of seven women who commit to one Holy Hour of Eucharistic Adoration per week for a specific priest. Each member prays on a fixed day of the week for one year (June to June). Any hour of the day is permissible for the day to which you commit, and need not always be at the same time.

Under normal circumstances, the hour is to be made in any Catholic Church so as to adore the Lord in the monstrance or tabernacle. However, under certain circumstances, homebound women may join a team and pray from home. Please inquire for further details!

Substitute members provide coverage in the event that a permanent member cannot fulfill her hour, and new substitutes are needed as well. One of the best benefits of Nar-Anon is that you will find compassion and support from others who are experiencing similar problems and struggles as well as people who have made it through these struggles. You will have the opportunity to hear stories from other members who have addicts in their families as well and see what coping mechanisms worked for them.

All information and discussion at the meetings are non-judgmental, informative, and strictly confidential. The meetings are in Room 100 in the Parish Life Center on Thursday from 7-8 pm and are open to the community at large.
