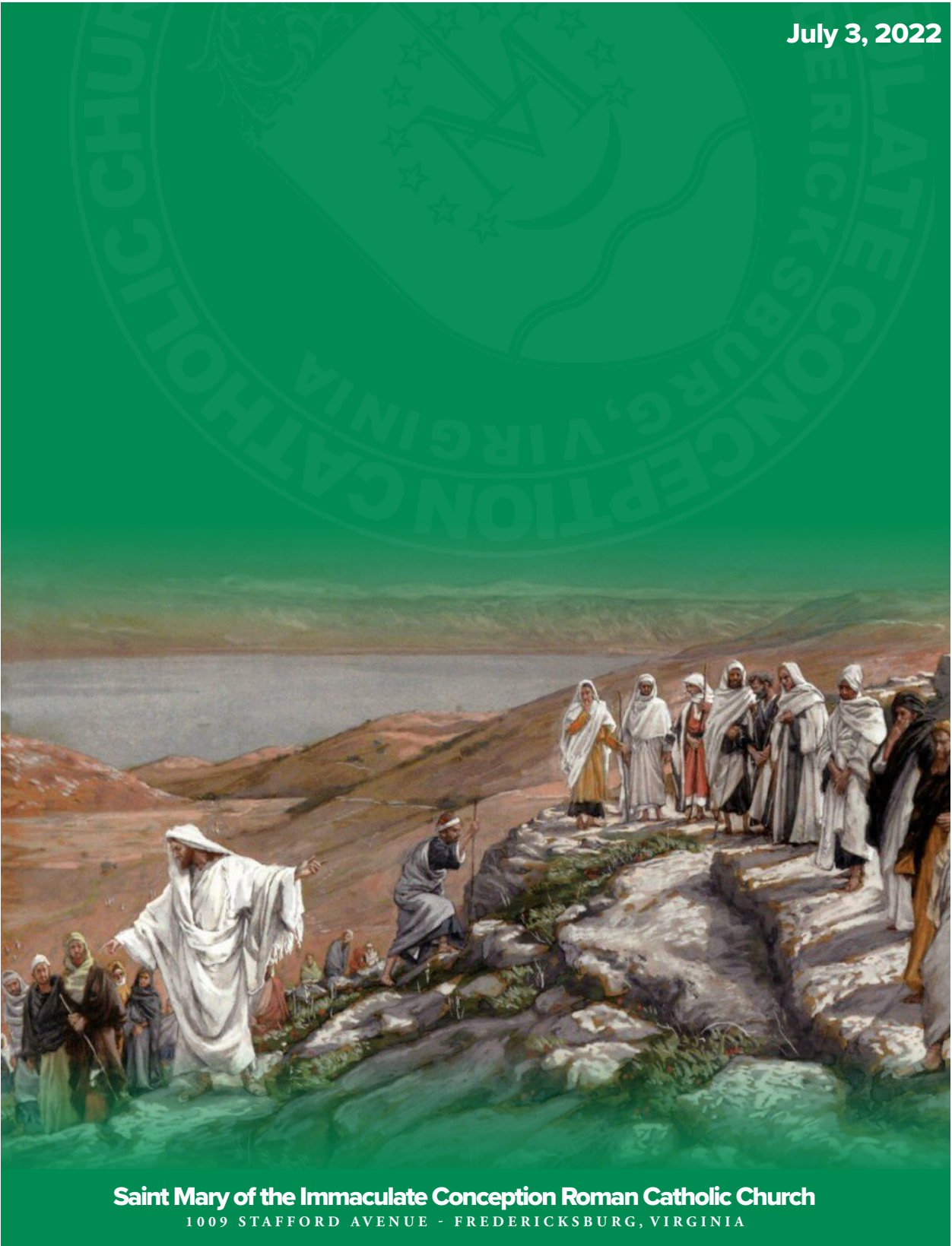

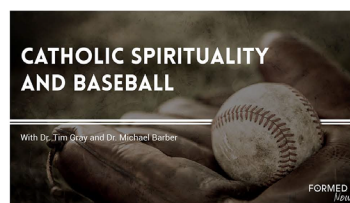
JOHN PAUL II IN AMERICA: UNITING A CONTINENT

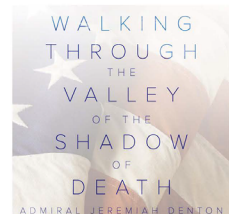

Please purchase ALL the items on the list that is stapled to the bag and return the completed bag to the parish office at your earliest convenience.

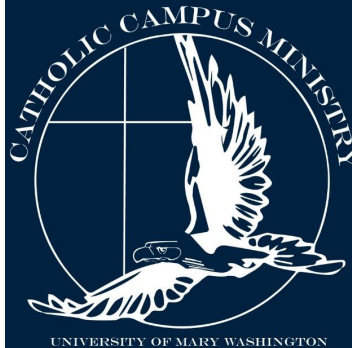

Father Renner Looks Forward to Fraternity and Faith

The college student was walking through campus when he bumped into his former parish priest. The transfer student, Father Robert C. Renner, hadn't realized there was a campus ministry at the University of Mary Washington in Fredericksburg until the priest and university chaplain, Father Christopher T. Vaccaro, invited him to join during that chance encounter. Nurtured by the Catholic community there and the faith formation he received as a child, Father Renner discerned his call to the priesthood.

He was born Sept. 4, 1994, in Arlington to Chris and Lambie Renner, the last of their four children. The family attended Holy Spirit Church in Annandale and the children attended the parish school. At Bishop O'Connell High School in Arlington, he participated in soccer, track, the video production club, the pro-life club and the nap club, which he founded.



"Really, it was just an excuse to make a silly club with my friends, but we legitimized it in a couple ways," he said. "We did a fundraiser where we sold T-shirts and pajama pants, and the money that we made we donated to a company that buys mosquito nets for children in Africa or other risk areas for malaria so that way they can sleep in peace."

At Mary Washington, the Fellowship of Catholic University Student (FOCUS) missionaries helped him deepen his faith life, and a suggestion that he should consider the priesthood kicked off his discernment. He graduated in 2016 with a degree in geography and spent the summer as a backcountry guide in the Colorado Rockies before entering Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, Md., that year.

Father Renner will be parochial vicar of St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception Parish in Fredericksburg. "There are five men in the rectory so I'm looking forward to fraternity with those men, but also I know the faith of the people in that parish and it's going to be a wonderful assignment," he said.

As Father Renner started discerning during the Year of Mercy, he's looking forward to hearing confessions. "Personally, confession has been a necessity, a place of great growth and grace, so I'm excited to be on the other side of the screen," he said.

His first Mass of thanksgiving will be celebrated at Holy Spirit on Pentecost, the parish's feast. Coincidentally, Father John M. O'Donohue, pastor, was parochial vicar at the church when Father Renner was a boy. "It's going to be beautiful," he said.

Children's Offertory Contributions for the month of July will be donated to Families of the Wounded Fund. This fund was created in 2005 to help the families of service members who come to McGuire Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Richmond with traumatic brain injuries and spinal-cord injuries from combat in Iraq and Afghanistan. Former Army Captain William Haneke, a wounded Vietnam Veteran, and some colleagues recognized the need to assist family members who were away from home tending to their loved ones when they saw two young mothers with babies arrive from across the country with no money and barely enough gas to make the trip. The organization gives 100 percent of all tax-deductible donations to the families to help with food, lodging, transportation, child care, diapers and long-distance calling cards during the many weeks a family is in the Richmond area, and each family who qualifies currently receives \$9,000.00. Are You Affected By A Loved Ones' Addiction to Drugs?

If you are, please be aware that there is a program at St Mary that offers support to family members and friends of loved ones struggling with this problem. The program is called Nar-Anon.

One of the best benefits of Nar-Anon is that you will find compassion and support from others who are experiencing similar problems and struggles as well as people who have made it through these struggles. You will have the opportunity to hear stories from other members who have addicts in their families as well and see what coping mechanisms worked for them.

All information and discussion at the meetings are non-judgmental, informative, and strictly confidential. The meetings are in Room 100 in the Parish Life Center on Thursday from 7-8 pm and are open to the community at large.
