

from our pastor pax et bonum

Dear Folks,

Let me tell a story of the first time I gave Holy Communion to a special needs child. Or more rightly I should say special needs adult, but one whose needs meant that physically he was small in stature, confined to bed, and unable to communicate in a way that I could understand.

I was in my last year of seminary, serving as a Deacon in a West Philly parish. The pastor said to me, "take this mother and her son communion. He is special needs, and he won't be able to communicate, but I want you to give them both communion." So I went. And I was nervous. But what about his ability to understand the Holy Eucharist? How will this be reverent? Can I give Holy Communion like this?

And I only remember one specific thing about that communion visit: the face of the young man lit up like a spotlight when I held up the Host to offer Holy Communion. All the ways I expected to measure were melted in the radiance of that face. He was so happy... no, happiness is in the emotions. It was uncomplicated joy that shone forth from his soul reflecting the glory of God.

I remember thinking, "who am I to say that his understanding of the Eucharist is more deficient than mine?" And I filed away the lesson to learn to see beyond the surface. Thus when folks with children with special needs ask me about their children receiving Our Lord, I say, "why not!" Infants can receive at baptism, and Our Lord has love for all of his children. Let the children come unto Him.

Recently we celebrated Mass with sacraments for students in our SPRED program, as described in the bulletin this week. This is religious ed for special needs sons and daughters of Our Lord! It was a joyful Mass, and one that I am proud of the welcome that has been extended by our parish, and, I am proud to say that they are our brothers and sisters in Christ.

I am from Fairfax Station, Virginia and grew up going to Holy Spirit Parish in Annandale, VA where my whole family went to grade school. I then went to Bishop O'Connell High School in Arlington, VA where I played soccer, ran track, was involved in various clubs, and allegedly learned things in class. While in college, I worked one summer as a canoe guide for the Boy Scouts in Canada and was coming to a



crossroads in my life. I met all types of people and had a really wonderful experience in the Northwoods but never made it to Mass all summer and knew something was wrong.

A few weeks later I was in Fredericksburg and happened to bump into a priest who I knew, Fr. Chris Vaccaro, the chaplain to Mary Washington University. I started going to the campus ministry and made many good friends. I began to pray each day and realized what I was missing in my life, a real relationship with the God I had heard too much about growing up. A few months after developing a real spiritual life I began to discern the priesthood.

As I was looking for a summer job, I wanted to find a way to combine my two favorite things, the outdoors and Jesus. Thankfully, I found just the thing in Camp Wojtyla. Camp Wojtyla is a Catholic Outdoor Adventure Camp in Boulder, CO. You could think of it like Outward Bound but with the faith. I came back to a muggy Fredericksburg in August after spending the summer in dry Colorado to finish my last year of college at UMW before heading back to Colorado the next summer to develop a backpacking program for Camp Wojtyla.

After a second summer in Colorado, I returned back home to go to seminary at Mount St. Mary's Seminary in Emmitsburg, MD where I studied for the past six years. There were three main things that were great about seminary: school, friends, and bikes. As for school, I concentrated in Moral Theology and really enjoyed the varying classes on topical issues. As for friends, I made some deep friendships with guys I still keep in close contact with and hope to soon visit. As for bikes, I started riding a bike a lot in seminary. It is both a great way to exercise and also the source of some of my best friendships. Whether it is a road or gravel ride, or a cross country track, or an enduro trail, I am always ready to get out for a ride to interact with the beautiful creation God has given to us.

It is a great joy to be a priest assigned here to St. Mary and I am excited for what the Lord has in store for me.

Religion's Relationship to Happiness, Civic Engagement and Health around the World

In the U.S. and other countries, participation in a congregation is a key factor

"People who are active in religious congregations tend to be happier and more civically engaged than either religiously unaffiliated adults or inactive members of religious groups, according to a new Pew Research Center analysis of survey data from the United States and more than two dozen other countries.

Religiously active people also tend to smoke and drink less, but they are not healthier in terms of exercise frequency and rates of obesity. Nor, in most countries, are highly religious people more likely to rate themselves as being in very good overall health – though the U.S. is among the possible exceptions.

Many previous studies have found positive associations between religion and health in the United States. Researchers have shown, for example, that Americans who regularly attend religious services tend to live longer. 1 Other studies have focused on narrower health benefits, such as how religion may help breast cancer patients cope with stress. On the other hand, there are also studies that have not found a robust relationship between religion and better health in the U.S., and even some studies that have shown negative relationships, such as higher rates of obesity among highly religious Americans."

This fund was created in 2005 to help the families of service members who come to McGuire Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Richmond with traumatic brain injuries and spinal-cord injuries from combat in Iraq and Afghanistan. Former Army Captain William Haneke, a wounded Vietnam Veteran, and some colleagues recognized the need to assist family members who were away from home tending to their loved ones when they saw two young mothers with babies arrive from across the country with no money and barely enough gas to make the trip. The organization gives 100 percent of all taxdeductible donations to the families to help with food, lodging, transportation, child care, diapers and long-distance calling cards during the many weeks a family is in the Richmond area, and each family who qualifies currently receives \$9,000.00.
