

Dear Folks,

Good news: The Noon Mass on Tuesdays and Thursdays will continue! It is time to make it a fixed part of the schedule even outside of special seasons. So let it be the law of the parish: Daily Masses are 6:30 am, 9 am, and 12 Noon every day Monday - Friday.

With the Eucharist being the source and summit of our lives, I am so glad to see the great crowds that come to the Noon Mass. And we are blessed with five priests in the parish, so we can make it work!

This brings up the topic of Mass intentions. This week we had a parish family whose grandparents were in a horrible accident. The grandfather passed away, and the grandmother is in intensive care. As a priest, my deepest desire was immediately to offer Mass for them. And as a priest, I was able to offer Mass for them on my day off, since I didn't have one of the parish Masses.

I know it can be frustrating to desire to have a Mass offered, and find out that all of our Masses for 2022

are already claimed! Ouch. And our book of Mass intentions for 2023 won't open until November. Oooff.

#### The Catechist Does with Doctrine What Choir Director Does with Music



"Divine Revealation is both the source and the model for all cathetical instruction. When God descends to us, He reveals Himself and His plan, while adapting the the expression to our limitations, speaking in terms we can understand. The Incrnation is is the ultimate expression to our limitations, speakning in terms we can understand. The Incarnation is the ultimate expression of this marvelous condescension of God – the Word becomes flesh and dwells among us, drawing us to the Father by His melodious teaching. By His Paschal Mystery, He has opened the the way for us to share in His life by being united to Him. Finally, after His Ascension, He entrusts the masterpiece of His Mystery to the Church, endowing her

with the divine power to hand it down from age to age. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, her proclamation of the word draws others to communion with Christ and insertion into His mystery. ...

The task of the catechist can be compared to that of a masterful choir director. The best choral directors are marked by their high expectations for their choir, their accurate assessment of their choir's capacities and constraints, and their ability to suit the music to their choir. Rather than being limited in their choice of music by their choir's capabilities, skillful directors enable their choir to participate in classic compositions by arranging the piece to suit the needs of the choir. The catechist does exactly the same thing with the deposit of faith. She expertly discerns the essential melody originating from Christ and echoes it down to her students. She also teaches them to recognize the signicant "chords" of the great symphony of faith. By this she not only enables her students to appreciate its beauty, but to join their voices to it in a profession of faith. To participate in the magnum opus of Christ, her arrangements must remain true to His teaching. It is not her own composition; she merely serves it, enabling it to come to life in particular persons. Yet, her person and role is crucial in the arranging of the content and its delivery. No one can take the place of the catechist in this. Her witness and and her relationshipwith the students is essential. ...


#### **Neighbors in Need of Items**



# **Little Sisters of the Poor Collection**

August 6 & 7

Next weekend our second collection will be for the Little Sisters of the Poor, who have provided a home and compassionate care for Virginia's elderly poor since 1874. Although the Sisters no longer have a Home in Richmond, they are able to care for the elderly poor in 24 Homes throughout the United States, including one in Washington DC and one in Baltimore, and the Parish wishes to support them as it has each year for over 25 years. Because their residents are of limited financial means, the Little Sisters depend upon the charity of friends and benefactors to operate their Homes. Your generosity will enable the Sisters to continue welcoming the needy elderly and providing them with the love and dignity they deserve. All donations should be made payable to St. Mary Catholic Church, and put in an envelope clearly marked "Little Sisters of the Poor". #### **Children's Offertory Envelopes for August**

All Children's Charity donations for the month of August will be donated to Leashes of Valor, a national nonprofit working to provide a highlytrained service dog to every post-9/11 Veteran who needs one to ease the symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) or Military Sexual Trauma (MST), an underlying trauma to PTSD. Their mission is as simple as it is critical: bring service dogs and post-9/11 Veterans together to enrich the lives of both. Leashes of Valor was founded in May 2017 by three United States Military Veterans with over 40 years of combined service and expertise in service dog policy and law, military canines and canine training, who know the healing power of canines because they experienced it themselves. The facility is located on a 20 acre farm in rural Virginia, with a live-in facility for training veteran and service dog teams. Training a service dog costs \$25,000.00 per dog, but thanks to the generosity of donors, veterans who receive a Leashes of Valor service dog pay nothing.
