Dear Folks,

Religious Education, CCD or Faith Formation - lots of names for the same task, teaching the content of our faith to our children. This weekend at all Masses we will be are signing up our children for religious education. The pandemic has led to a drop in RE enrollment, which is unfortunate! Now, more than ever, we need to share the faith with our future generations. We must use our best talents and energies to hand on that which is most important. I recently saw this quote in the Forward to YouCat (the youth catechism):

Study the Catechism! This is my heartfelt desire. Study the catechism with passion and perseverance. Study it in the quiet of your room; read it with a friend; form study groups and networks; share with each other on the Internet.... You need to be more deeply rooted in the faith than the generation of your parents...

The line that most caught my eye was the last, about being "more deeply rooted in the faith than the generation of your parents." This made me think, "Wow, strong words from Pope Benedict XVI! But it also evoked the sentiment that I often hear, "I just want to give my kids better than I had growing up." Really, it ends up being very revelatory of what the new parents value. Unfortunately, when I ask for some specifics the list usually ends up being financial, emotional, and educational, but almost never spiritual. We all have limited time, talent, energy, and resources. Are we handing on a fuller expression of the faith so that our children will be even more deeply rooted than we are? That should be our goal!

I want to especially thank those who teach and are aides to the Religious Education department, I know that they are pouring out thier time, talents, and energy into this task. Thank you for your willingness to teach profess, live, and teach our faith!







Pro-Life Reflection

On August 22 we observe the Queenship of Mary, acknowledging that the highest place that any creature holds in Heaven is occupied by a woman and a mother. To be pro-life is to be pro-woman, and Mary the Mother of God is an inspiration for all women about how to embrace the vocation of motherhood, facing the unexpected with faith, courage and joy. Queen of Heaven, grant all your people a deep appreciation of the dignity of women, of motherhood, and of life.

Children's Offertory Envelopes for August

All Children's Charity donations for the month of August will be donated to Leashes of Valor, a national nonprofit working to provide a highly-trained service dog to every post-9/11 Veteran who needs one to ease the symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) or Military Sexual Trauma (MST), an underlying trauma to PTSD. Their mission is as simple as it is critical: bring service dogs and post-9/11 Veterans together to enrich the lives of both. Leashes of Valor was founded in May 2017 by three United States Military Veterans with over 40 years of combined service and expertise in service dog policy and law, military canines and canine training, who know the healing power of canines because they experienced it themselves. The facility is located on a 20 acre farm in rural Virginia, with a live-in facility for training veteran and service dog teams. Training a service dog costs \$25,000.00 per dog, but thanks to the generosity of donors, veterans who receive a Leashes of Valor service dog pay nothing. Praying with the Saints

The Queenship of Mary, August 22nd

In the fourth century Saint Ephrem called Mary "Lady" and "Queen." Later Church fathers and doctors continued to use the title. Hymns of the 11th to 13th centuries address Mary as queen: "Hail, Holy Queen," "Hail, Queen of Heaven," "Queen of Heaven." The Dominican rosary and the Franciscan crown as well as numerous invocations in Mary's litany celebrate her queenship. The feast is a logical follow-up to the Assumption, and is now celebrated on the octave day of that feast. In his 1954 encyclical To the Queen of Heaven, Pius XII points out that Mary deserves the title because she is Mother of God, because she is closely associated as the New Eve with Jesus' redemptive work, because of her preeminent perfection, and because of her intercessory power.

Saint Rose of Lima, August 23nd

Saint Rose of Lima, you were young and holy. You dedicated your body and soul to God while still a child. Through your example and through your heavenly intercession, help all Catholics, especially the young, to dedicate their lives to God from the very start.

Saint Bartholomew, Apostle, August 24th

Saint Bartholomew, help all Christians to see in your example of martyrdom a heroic witness to perseverance in the face of difficulty, of fidelity in the face of doubt, and of courage in the face of timidity. May we have just a portion of what you had in such abundance.

Saint Louis of France, King, August 25th

Saint Louis of France, you were intrepid in your love for Christ and the Church. Impart from heaven to all modern Catholics some of your same daring spirit—to be courageous in living and spreading the faith, to give and not count the cost.

Saint Joseph Calanz, Patron of Catholic Schools & Children, August 25th

Saint Joseph Calasanz, you were disgraced, defamed, maligned and imprisoned and yet forgave all who had robbed you of your most precious personal possession: your reputation. Help us to be so forgiving toward those who steal from us what we have taken so long to build up.

Saint Monica, August 27th

Saint Monica, you were persevering in your efforts to straighten the crooked paths of your son's life. Your prayers, pilgrimages, fasts, and words were fruitful, but only after many tears. Help us to be as concerned as you for the immortal souls of those who are close to us.
