



Respect Life Sunday National Life Chain Sunday - October 2 from 2-3:30pm

What is a Life Chain?

The first Life Chain, born through prayer, was built in 1987 by Please Let Me Live, a small pro-life ministry in Yuba City, California. From its small beginning, the Life Chain has grown to over 1,800 Life Chains in the United States and Canada, and is a call to the Christian Church to mobilize against an abortion holocaust that claims over one million American lives annually, and has claimed over sixty million lives worldwide, through surgical abortion. The Life Chain is a peaceful, prayerful, silent demonstration. Hundreds of Christians – clergy and lay people -- stand 25 to 50 feet apart to form a prayer chain and hold signs reading Abortion Kills Children, Jesus Forgives and Heals, Adoption: The Loving Option, Lord, Forgive Us and Our Nation, Life: The First Inalienable Right. This powerful, visual impact not only raises community awareness but has also been credited with saving children's lives. Consider the words of Pope Saint John Paul II who said, "When life before birth is attacked, we will stand up. No one ever has the authority to destroy unborn human life."

St. Mary Parish will again participate in the Annual Life Chain on Sunday, October 2 and welcomes all our parishioners and local churches as well. We will meet in front of the Parish Life Center at 1:45pm to pick up our signs and walk up to Emancipation Highway (Route 1), where we will form a chain along Route 1 from Stafford Avenue to College Avenue. Please join us and take a stand for the unborn.

Saint Francis of Assisi, October 4th:

Saint Faustina Kowalska, October

Known as a computer whiz, Carlo also liked to play soccer, video games, and the saxophone. His unwavering devotion to the Eucharist inspired him to tell the story of Eucharistic miracles through a website he created. Carlo died from a sudden and violent illness in 2006 at the age of fifteen. He was beatified by Pope Francis in October 2020. The next step will be canonization, making Carlo the first millennial saint. Please join us!



Respect Life Sunday

Each October the Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is observed as Respect Life Sunday. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable, from the beginning of life to its end, and at every point in between. During the month of October, the Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of every human life and pray for an end to the abortion holocaust that claims over one million American lives annually and has claimed over sixty-one million lives worldwide through surgical abortion.

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops provides many resources to help parishes, schools, families, ministries, and individual Catholics share the Gospel of Life during Respect Life Month and throughout the year. We encourage you to visit **respectlife.org** for many resources, prayers and devotion to help us join as a parish family in praying for an end to the holocaust of abortion and for the election of officials on all levels who will continue to defend life.

Pro-Life Reflection

In The Gospel of Life, Pope St. John Paul II commends "brave mothers... who are ready to make any effort, to face any sacrifice, in order to pass on to [their children] the best of themselves" (EV 86). As members of the 5.00 Body of Christ, we have a responsibility 2.00 to help mothers do just that. And there .00 are simple ways we can help mothers who desire to pursue educational achievements. *We can offer to babysit or do the grocery* shopping, so a mom has time to attend an 00 evening class or study for an exam. We can advocate for colleges and universities to provide flexibility for parenting students. 00 We can do these and so many other things. 00 Most importantly, we can pray for mothers to be given the grace and the support they 00 need, and for the wisdom to know how we can help.

Children's Offertory Envelopes for October

The children's charity that will benefit from Children's Offertory Envelopes in October is Safe Harbor Child Advocacy Center in Spotsylvania. This organization strives to strengthen the coordinated community response to situations of child maltreatment, including sexual abuse, severe physical abuse, severe neglect and fatalities, by integrating the existing resources of law enforcement, child protection, prosecution, medical and therapeutic agencies so that perpetrators are held accountable for their actions and children are not further traumatized by the investigative process. Children's Offertory Envelopes are available through Religious Education. All proceeds from these envelopes go to a different children's charity each month.
