Catholic Charities Refugee Migration Services

"Humbling" is the perfect word to describe the outpouring of support from our St. Mary Parish family which includes our Religious Education and Holy Cross Academy & Preschool families too! We set a goal of collecting enough food to provide 250 families with a Thanksgiving Meal and we exceeded that number! Our last count was 310 bags of food!

This past week we had the honor of welcoming 150 families supported by Catholic Charities Migration & Refugee Services and provided them each with a Thanksgiving Bag and Halal Chicken along with a note explaining the American tradition of Thanksgiving and our nations desire to express our profound gratitude to God for the many blessings He has given and continues to give each one of us. We wished them all a warm welcome and a Blessed & Happy Thanksgiving!

St. Mary's supported 50 families identified by Spotsylvania and Stafford County Schools social workers as in need of assistance. These amazing ladies arrived to pick up Thanksgiving Bags, turkeys and/or gift cards from Walmart to purchase a turkey, and left with cars packed to deliver directly to the homes of their clients – all super grateful to St. Mary Parish!

The remaining bags and turkeys (donated by our amazing Knights of Columbus) will go to our parishioners in need and others in the community who rely on St. Mary to assist them at Thanksgiving. Our extra bags will stock our St. Mary pantry which is used daily by folks seeking help with food insecurity.

We are all called to be the "Hands and Feet of Jesus Christ" as St. Mother Teresa teaches us, and I know that many of you give, because you have a heart for those less fortunate and happily do it anonymously. In my position as Outreach Director, I am privileged along with the staff at St. Mary's, to witness the gratitude of some of the recipients of your goodness. 
