

from our pastor

Dear Folks,

Three things this weekend:

1. Saturday is the Feast of the Annunciation! One of two solemnities that are so big that the church breaks its fast and penitential season to celebrate this major feast. (The other is St. Joseph's Feast Day which was last Monday).

When I meditate on the Annunciation, I contemplate the disposition of the Blessed Virgin to do whatever the Lord asked of her. I consider her radical availability, "be it done unto me according to your will." That generosity of availability for the Lord is one that we can cultivate and pray for.

We can cultivate it by doing the difficult things that would otherwise cause us to recoil. We can pray for added strength when we see that we said 'no' where our conscience was urging us to say 'yes.' Recently, I had a conversation with someone who is looking to apply for a job that they expect will be a stretch but also difficult to even be hired! The conversation led me to believe that his nerves and anxiety were really the Lord stirring his soul for the next way he wants him to grow. Enjoy the Feast of the Annunciation! Your 'yes' in the hands of God can work miracles.

- 2. Wizard of HCA!! By the time you read this, there will be, at most, one more production of our school play, The Wizard of Oz. There are rumors of a pastor having a small but wonderful role! Stay tuned for a picture, in case it happens!

The discipline of the Church includes abstaining from meat on Fridays during Lent (solid purple days) and fasting and abstaining from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting includes one regular meal, and the other two small meals are not to exceed a regular meal in quantity, with nothing between meals.

The concelebrated Mass of the Lord's Supper commemorates the institution of the Eucharist and the Priesthood by Jesus at the Last Supper. The commandment of love is symbolized by the Mandatum, or footwashing, where Jesus teaches, "As I have done, so must you also do." Parishioners are encouraged to join in the ancient procession of the Blessed Sacrament to Saint Mary Church, where adoration will continue until midnight as we accompany Jesus in his agony in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Although not a part of the formal observance of the Sacred Triduum Rites as such, this is a traditional custom of many churches. The seven last words of Jesus as he is crucified on the cross are presented every 25 minutes, each with a congregational hymn and choral selections. Clergy will give a reflection for each of the words of Jesus and the Three Hours will conclude with the public praying of the Stations of the Cross.

3_{PM} - St. Mary Church The Passion and Veneration of the Holy Cross (English)

We assemble in observance of Christ's saving death, by reading the narrative of his Passion, praying for the Universal Church, venerating his Cross in this ancient Rite and receiving Holy Communion which was consecrated on the previous evening at the Mass of the Lord's Supper.

The Good Friday collection assists the maintenance of the Shrines in the Holy Land.

What Sunday is to the week, Easter Sunday is to the year. This holiest of nights we celebrate the victory over death and promise of eternal life given to us by Jesus Christ in his resurrection from the dead. The Liturgy includes the Service of Light, the Vigil of Readings and Psalms, the Celebration of the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation for those who have prepared all year for initiation in the Catholic Church, and Liturgy of the Eucharist. Please note the unusual time that we begin: it marks the end of twilight and the beginning of the Solemnity of Easter Sunday.

Design For Excellence

Throughout this school year, Holy Cross Academy has been undergoing the Virginia Catholic Education Association's accreditation process, Design for Excellence. The school community completed a comprehensive self-study of its goals and how well its curriculum, student services, finances and facilities allow the school to achieve its mission. After we completed our self-study, a team of educators, not connected with the school, visited the school to judge the accuracy of our self-study and to offer commendations and recommendations to help us strengthen our program.

Perhaps the most vital part of the accreditation process was the updating of Holy Cross Academy's Mission Statement. The updated statement reads, Holy Cross Academy forms young men and women to be saints, scholars, and leaders in the image of our Lord Jesus Christ and our Blessed Mother. We feel that this aspirational statement perfectly reflects how we aim to form our students during their years at Holy Cross Academy.

On March 10, Holy Cross Academy successfully completed our accreditation visit. Our visiting team of eight veteran educators thoroughly enjoyed their time on campus spending time with our students and educators. The team visited each classroom and met with all faculty and staff, our priests, HCA parents, and students. They remarked about the engagement of Fr. Mosimann and his brother priests in the life of our school, our dedicated teachers and our wonderful, happy students. We look forward to receiving our official certification later this spring.

As with all hard work there is reward. Faculty and staff enjoyed an afternoon of fellowship and play after our successful visit.

Our sacrifices lead us to the Resurrection

Lent can feel like a long time. Sometimes we'd like to skip right to Easter! But just like studying for a test, practicing a sport or saving money, we often must do difficult tasks, make sacrifices and overcome obstacles to reach a worthy goal.

The 40 days we spend praying and doing penance helps us prepare to celebrate the Church's greatest feast day. Jesus had to go through his passion and death before he could rise. Our sacrifices enable us to experience—in a small way—Christ's suffering, and they lead us to the joy and wonder of His resurrection.



Over the last few weeks, we've learned how people in Honduras, the Philippines and Kenya made sacrifices so their families and communities can thrive. In Honduras, Rony fixed his reservoir and installed a low-cost system to water his fields. In the Philippines, Raul and Rhodora changed their jobs to ensure their granddaughters can be healthy and finish school. In Kenya, Rebecca learned how to use a new water system and different ways to farm. She also taught others in her community to use these new techniques. Rebecca spent time learning and teaching, but her sacrifice is now benefiting her family and entire community.

Children's Charity - April

The children's charity that will benefit from offerings in April is the Operation Purple Program of the National Military Family Association. When you hear "Operation Purple Camp" you should think: Kids Serve Too! The camps are a time for having fun, making friends, and reminding military kids that they are the Nation's youngest heroes.

The Operation Purple program was created in 2004 to fill a need identified by military parents to "help us help our kids." The mission of the Operation Purple program is to empower military children and their families to develop and maintain healthy and connected relationships, in spite of the current military environment. We do this through a variety of means, including the healing and holistic aspect of the natural world. The program is joint or "purple"—encompassing all Service branches, including the National Guard and Reserve.
