OUR HONORED PAST

1858 | Our Church is Built

Sunday, June 27, 1858, Bishop John McGill blessed and laid the cornerstone of the new church of Saint Mary of the Immaculate Conception, on Princess Anne Street Fredericksburg, Virginia. The new church was built in 9 months and dedicated on March 20, 1859.

1862-63 | Refuge for the Wounded

In December 1862, 200,000 troops marched into the city of Fredericksburg and thousands fell within blocks of the church. Our little church was stripped of its pews and used as a hospital for Union soldiers. The church again became a refuge for the wounded in May of 1863.

1971 | A New Church is Built

On June 20, 1971, the parish moved to its current location having outgrown our downtown church. Parishioners ran a Capital Campaign and were instrumental in raising the \$400,000.00 needed to build both the church and the rectory.

1997 | Holy Cross Academy is Built

After providing a Catholic education for a half-century, under the direction of the Daughters of Wisdom, Montfort Academy was sold to the US National Park Service in June 1997. At the invitation of Bishop John Keating, the Oblate Sisters opened a new school, Holy Cross Academy on the current 25-acre site.

Dear Folks,

Where can anyone ever find the strength to overcome temptation?

There is a phrase in the biblical account of Susannah, where the two old lechers are described as falling into temptation by "refusing to raise their eyes to heaven and refusing to let God strengthen them."

Overcoming temptation requires being able to rise above self. Above all feelings, all opinions and dislikes, so that we gaze upon God and bind ourselves to him by a glance, movement of our heart, or assent of our will.

Saint Jane Frances de Chantal said, "Look at God. Do this and nothing more. Remain in him in peace of mind and utter trust, completely given over to his care. Since you have confided to him and placed in his hands all that you are, let him now take charge, for you have handed over everything to his faithful love. Now you must work out your salvation on this cross. Let me assure you that he is sheltering you in his arms. So even though you feel nothing of this, remain content with your discontent.

To hold oneself in patience when suffering is already a high state of prayer, you may be sure, so do not force yourself to conscious acts. To gaze upon God while suffering with gentleness and submission is quite enough. Virtuous feelings do not lie within our power, but virtuous conduct does indeed lie within our power.

This is what God requires of you at the moment, while he holds you on the cross. The way of generous suffering is the way to heaven. Stand fast and bear your cross without thinking about it."

Pro-Life Reflection

"Gianna Beretta Molla was a simple, but more than ever, significant messenger of divine love. In a letter to her future husband a few days before their marriage, she wrote: 'Love is the most beautiful sentiment the Lord has put into the soul of men and women'. Following the example of Christ, who 'having loved his own... loved them to the end' (Jn 13: 1), this holy mother of a family remained heroically faithful to the commitment she made on the day of her marriage. The extreme sacrifice she sealed with her life testifies that only those who have the courage to give of themselves totally to God and to others are able to fulfill themselves. Through the example of Gianna Beretta Molla, may our age rediscover the pure, chaste and fruitful beauty of conjugal love, lived as a response to the divine call!" (From the canonization homily of Pope Joĥn Paul II) -- Saint Gianna Beretta Molla, a model for all mothers, gave her life to save the life of her unborn baby. She was beatified on April 24, 1994 and canonized on May 16, 2004. Saint Gianna Beretta Molla, pray for us.
