

A Note from Fr. Sean Koehr

Dear St. Mary's Family,

As I write, I am about to enter silence for the next 30 days to spend intimate time with my Lord. I will be receiving the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius during the month of July as I prepare for my next mission in the Navy. St. Augustine once said, "Men go abroad to wonder at the heights of mountains, at the huge waves of the sea, at the long courses of the rivers, at the vast compass of the ocean, at the circular motions of the stars, and they pass by themselves without wondering."

As I take the time to wonder at the immense blessings and mercy of God in my soul, I think of you. You are a manifestation of God's love for me. I do not have the opportunity to thank each of you personally before I begin my retreat, but I am overwhelmed with gratitude for the outpouring of prayer and affection from so many of you over the past four years.

When a father becomes a father for the first time, he doesn't know how to be a father. His firstborn teaches him. His spouse teaches him. The family pulls the love out of him. The family teaches him how to protect and provide, encourage and nurture those placed under his care. I think sometimes of an account written by a Catholic convert from atheism, Jennifer Fulwiler. Because we have encountered uncreated love, through created beings, we owe to them a veneration of gratitude and respect. To love our families, parishes, city, and country does not mean that we are blind to faults. It is because we love that we can strive to improve every level of society.

Why do I love America? Because Jesus commanded me to "Love the Lord God with your whole heart, mind and soul; and love your neighbor as yourself."

I hope you enjoyed the holiday. God Bless America.


VBS 2023 Empowering Today's Kids with ROCK Solid Catholic Doctrine!

Chairman's Statement on Dobbs Anniversary

June 24, 2023, marks the one-year anniversary of the Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v*. *Jackson Women's Health Organization*, and we have much to celebrate. By the grace of God, the nearly fifty-year reign of national abortion on demand has been put to an end. *Roe v. Wade*—a seemingly insurmountable blight on our nation—is no more! This is a day for continued joy and for gratitude; a day to recall the countless faithful laborers who have dedicated themselves to prayer, action, witness, and service in support of the cause of life; and a day to thank God for His unending faithfulness.

Even as we celebrate, we are reminded that this is not the *end*, but the *beginning* of a critical new phase in our efforts to protect human life. Despite this momentous legal victory, sobering and varied challenges lie ahead of us. Over the past year, while some states have acted to protect preborn children, others have tragically moved to enshrine abortion in law—enacting extreme abortion policies that leave children vulnerable to abortion, even until the moment of birth.

In this shifting political landscape, we persist confidently in our efforts to defend life. The work that lies ahead continues to be not just changing laws but also helping to change hearts, with steadfast faith in the power of God to do so. The task before us begins with our knowledge of the truth and our courage to *speak* it and to *live* it with compassion.

Each of us is called to radical solidarity with women facing an unexpected or challenging pregnancy. That means doing whatever we can to provide them with the care and support they need to welcome their children. I thank the millions of individual Catholics who are already personally living out this Gospel call through parish and community initiatives like <u>Walking with Moms in Need</u>.

We must likewise extend a compassionate hand to all who are suffering in the aftermath of participation in abortion. The Church continues to share Christ's healing and infinite mercy with women and men through diocesan <u>Project Rachel Ministries</u>.

As we each consider how we are uniquely called to build a culture of life, I invite you to join a growing community of Catholics who have subscribed to Respect Life Prayer and Action. When you sign up, you will receive prayers, alerts to contact Congress and government leaders on important legislation, and ways to strengthen a culture of life in your community. You can sign up today at <u>respectlife.org/prayer-and-action</u>.

May all people of faith and good will work together to proclaim that human life is a precious gift from God; that each person who receives this gift has responsibilities toward God, self and others; and that society, through its laws and social institutions, must protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence.

Tasks include helping with school information, college opportunities, job applications and many more. The opportunities for learning and discovery are endless. Refugee youth often have questions about our country, how to navigate community resources and even how to drive. We ask for a minimum of 6 months commitment and at least 2 hours a week as our youth are in need of stability and consistency in their relationships with new individuals.
