

UPDATE FROM THE BUILDING COMMITTEE

HCA Expansion

Over the month of June and into July the Building Committee and staff members from HCA have participated in ten in-depth design meetings with the architecture team for the expansion of Holy Cross Academy.

The meetings covered varied topics such as security; chapel design; kitchen; furnishings; fixtures and equipment; final finish materials; door and door hardware; final classrooms, maker space, cafeteria, lounge etc; playground relocation/expansion; admin area layout and function and mechanical equipment (ie HVAC).

Currently the architectural team is finalizing the design based on the output of the meetings. We anticipate the final design to be sent to Stafford County for permitting no later than September around the same time, request to obtain bids are submitted. Our plan is to break ground in the spring of 2024

We have approached a very critical phase of fundraising where we have to more accurately budget expenses in order to begin the next phases. Since Fr. Mosimann has consistently promised to "build what the parish is willing to support financially", it's crucial that we obtain as many pledges in the coming weeks as possible so that our dreams and plans can be realized!

We are grateful to all who have received a visit, and if you're still contemplating your sacrificial pledge and/ or whether to schedule a meeting, the sooner you act the more benefit it will be for the planning phases and future Diocesan approval requests. Thank you.

Folks,

Let me renew an exhortation that I share from time to time, because we can all use a reminder. I grew up living in a court and the unwritten law of the land was that you didn't park in front of your neighbor's house. This seems to be a 'suburbs thing.' I do recall how annoyed I was when folks parked in front of our house. Sometimes it seemed intentional, like when there was a spot open in front of their own house. I had to learn to 'offer it up,' as we all learn to deal with being human and annoying one another.

Ok, now St. Mary's. We are surrounded on all sides by a residential neighborhood. And as good neighbors, we must be aware that our parking needs can and sometimes do annoy our neighbors. If you worry that you can't go to the store on weekends because there will be no parking near your home when you return, yeah.... that is difficult.

There are times when our parking spills out into the neighborhood, and becomes a pain point for our neighbors. As pastor I have tried to address that in part by adding Masses at Holy Cross Academy, especially on our most congested days. We have the tradition of celebrating Easter at the Expo Center. And the City recently added spaces along William Street to help with extra parking. Additionally, sometimes we are so full of the Holy Spirit at the end of the Mass that we want to fly.... and we fly out of the parking lot with the speed of the eagles. We must not drive through residential sidestreets in a manner that is not safe. There have been accidents on William Street!

What can we all do?

1. Please use the parking lot as much as possible. Many folks park along other residential streets when there are still plenty of parking spaces in the lot (obviously b/c it allows for a quicker departure and not having to deal with the lot).

2. When you do park on residential streets, be sure that you are parking where it is permitted! For example, weekday parking is residential only on certain streets. Law enforcement has a duty to ticket this behavior and often does!

3. When you encounter neighbors, remember that you represent Jesus and His Catholic Church!

4. When you drive on residential streets, especially Stafford Avenue, remember this is a neighborhood with children at play.

Let's be good neighbors, as charity begins with the Lord, and continues as we exit the parking lot and into all of our daily lives.

That One Time Jesus Got Lost... And What it Taught Me About Parenting

Seven Tips on Parenting I Learned When Mary and Joseph Lost Jesus

1. Every parent worries.

The word anxiety screamed at me during this reading. Mary and Joseph felt "great anxiety" as parents to Jesus? The thought is comforting. Not only is it normal to worry about our children, the most wonderful set of parents in all of history, the earthly parents of the Living God, experienced this type of emotion.

There is a healthy amount of anxiety that we can have about parenting. This worrying keeps us diligent and on task. When we feel anxious, we turn to God and pray for wisdom, guidance and protection. What causes you to be most anxious as a parent? Take a moment to give it over to the Lord in trust.

2. Mistakes happen.

Mary was without sin, but she still made an innocent mistake as a parent. Though the times were different then, Mary and Joseph probably should have checked in with Jesus (or whoever they thought was responsible for him) before leaving Jerusalem. It wasn't a sin, it was rather an accident or a miscommunication of some kind, but still it happened.

We make mistakes as parents all the time. In the chaos and busyness of life, we forget appointments, misplace important papers, or even leave a child behind. Learn from Mary and Joseph. Don't beat yourself up over mistakes. Apologize and do whatever is necessary to make things right again, but don't dwell on it. Show yourself mercy by not expecting perfection at all times. 



Children's Charity - August

All Children's Charity donations for the month of August will be donated to Leashes of Valor, a national nonprofit working to provide a highly-trained service dog to every post-9/11 Veteran who needs one to ease the symptoms of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) or Military Sexual Trauma (MST), an underlying trauma to PTSD. Their mission is as simple as it is critical: bring service dogs and post-9/11 Veterans together to enrich the lives of both. Leashes of Valor was founded in May 2017 by three United States Military Veterans with over 40 years of combined service and expertise in service dog policy and law, military canines and canine training, who know the healing power of canines because they experienced it themselves. The facility is located on a 20 acre farm in rural Virginia, with a live-in facility for training veteran and service dog teams.Training a service dog costs \$25,000.00 per dog, but thanks to the generosity of donors, veterans who receive a Leashes of Valor service dog pay nothing. 
