



Families that attend the Monday 6:30pm session can arrive anytime from 6:30 to 7:30pm. Each family will spend about 20-25 minutes here and accomplish four tasks.

- 1. Meet catechist and get textbooks.
- 2. Get information on children's Sacraments and adult formation,
- 3. Visit the church
- 4. Enjoy a treat and participate in a raffle.



Why Do We Attend Religious Education Classes Every Year?

The Spiral Curriculum Explains

To ensure consistent progress and development, the Christ Our Life series employs the spiral curriculum, originally introduced by Loyola Press ion 1973. The program for each level builds upon the previous ones, following a pattern of continuous growth in depth and scope.

At the heart of *Christ our Life* program is a harmonious integration of Scripture, Traditions, and action. In the spiral curriculum, Scripture is centered between the four fundamental themes of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*: Creed, Sacraments, Morality and Prayer. In addition, Catholic social teachings are woven in each chapter to emcourage active participation in the faith.

In the New Evangelization edition, the **Gather and Go Forth** pages help students live as disciples of Christ and learn about a different saint in every chapter.

This is why it is very important for children to attend Religious Education classes every year. Consistent attendance, with the support of their families, students **know, proclaim, witness and share the Catholic faith.**






