

from our pastor

Folks,

Behold He Makes All Things New!

With our prayer for Renewal of Love for the Blessed Sacrament, I am reminded of many questions about the fast before receiving Communion. Canon law states, "One who is to receive the most Holy Eucharist is to abstain from any food or drink, with the exception only of water and medicine, for at least the period of one hour before Holy Communion" (CIC 919 §1). Elderly people, those who are ill, and their caretakers are excused from the Eucharistic fast (CIC 191 §3). Now some specifications:

- 1. The hour is counted from the time of receiving Holy Communion, not from the beginning of Mass. So yes, a long homily, can help here! On Sundays Communion is almost never less than 30 minutes after Mass starts. Mostly this just means you can't eat on your way to Mass.
- Coffee and chewing gum DO BREAK the fast. Water does not. So no Starbucks pit stop on your way to Mass.
- 3. Medicine never breaks the fast. If the medicine requires that it be taken with food, then this food does not break the fast.
- 4. Sometimes I visit folks in hospitals, and they don't know when I will arrive. If I arrive just after a meal, notice that the fast does not apply to the "ill and their caretakers."
- 5. The parish priests can, in individual cases, wave the fast for you. So, if you accidentally eat something, you could ask a priest to waive the required fast for you.

This last point leads to a story where I once had a high schooler who knew that I could waive the fast. One day he came to me asking to have it waived. Because I knew him well, and that he is a bit of a "wise guy", I decided to investigate, and the conversation went thus:

Fr: "Why do you need the fast waived?"

Wiseguy: "Because I ate a donut."

Fr: "When?"

WG: "Just now in the parking lot." Fr: "How could you possibly forget?"

WG: "I didn't, I just figured I'd get an exemption."

Fr: "You bought your ticket. You got your donut, and now you don't get Jesus."

All of this fast is about being sure to increase our spiritual hunger for Jesus, by controlling our physical hunger. The one builds off of the other and prepares us to more worthily receive Our Lord.





Children's Charity - September

In 2002, the Stafford County Sheriff's Department assessed the Olde Forge community, which was known for its high crime rate. The evaluation identified several challenges such as poverty, domestic violence, substance abuse, unsupervised children, and the arrival of non-English speaking and refugee families. In response, the Sheriff's Department launched a call for action that led to the establishment of Stafford Junction, a non-profit organization with a faith-based approach focused on enhancing the well-being of children and families in lowincome regions of Stafford County. Stafford Junction's programs prioritize education, nutrition, and healthy living. Its goal is to improve the lives of those living in low-resource areas by providing them with a path to a better future. For more information, visit their website at staffordjunction.org. What is a Life Chain?

The first Life Chain, born through prayer, was built in 1987 by Please Let Me Live, a small pro-life ministry in Yuba City, California. From its small beginning, the Life Chain has grown to over 1,800 Life Chains in the United States and Canada, and is a call to the Christian Church to mobilize against an abortion holocaust that claims over one million American lives annually, and has claimed over sixty million lives worldwide, through surgical abortion. The Life Chain is a peaceful, prayerful, silent demonstration. Hundreds of Christians - clergy and lay people -- stand 25 to 50 feet apart to form a prayer chain and hold signs reading Abortion Kills Children, Jesus Forgives and Heals, Adoption: The Loving Option, Lord, Forgive Us and Our Nation, Life: The First Inalienable Right. This powerful, visual impact not only raises community awareness but has also been credited with saving children's lives. Consider the words of Pope Saint John Paul II who said, "When life before birth is attacked, we will stand up. No one ever has the authority to destroy unborn human life."

St. Mary Parish will again participate in the Annual Life Chain on Sunday, October 1 and welcomes all our parishioners and local churches as well. We will meet in front of the Parish Life Center at 1:45pm to pick up our signs and walk up to Emancipation Highway (Route 1), where we will form a chain along Route 1 from Stafford Avenue to College Avenue. Please join us and take a stand for the unborn.
