

Folks,

Thanks for your generous response to the Capital Campaign as we are trying to bring it to a close. As the bulletin goes to press mid-week, the volunteers and staff are still working to sort the pledge envelopes. Thank you, Thank you, Thank you!

This Wednesday we also have the great Feast of All Saints which is a holy day of obligation, and Thursday is the Feast of All Souls. There are lots of Masses for these, but sometimes folks are confused as to which feast is which.

All Saints: Imagine that your grandmother were to be canonized a saint by Pope Francis. Your friends would all congratulate you, and you would joyfully make arrangements to go to Rome for the Mass and party. This feast is for celebrating all the uncanonized saints in heaven. This is the Church celebrating your friends and relatives who have gone to God forever and entered into eternal bliss beyond our imagining. We don't have to go to Rome for the canonization, but can all gather in our parishes to celebrate our loved ones union with God.

All Souls: Here we get to mercifully pray for our loved ones because the Lord doesn't tell us which of our loved ones are in heaven or which are in purgatory. True friends are always there to help each other. Souls who are in purgatory can no longer merit for themselves, as their souls are set in their eternal destiny. However, what they can't do, we do for them when we pray to the Lord to have mercy on their souls! Every prayer, every Hail Mary, every loving thought, is like a glass of water given to a thirsty soul, helping them get to heaven more quickly!

Don't worry, no soul in purgatory would ever trade places with you... because their presence in purgatory assures them of eternal bliss in heaven, just as soon as their soul is freed from disordered attachments. But what gratitude they have for even the smallest of our prayers.

You can do one thing to keep alive and even strengthen those bonds of love: pray for your loved ones. This is a sign of our gratitude to those we love, and our hope for reunion with them one day. It is our love that compels us to attend Mass and worship God for His great work in our families.


Year 1/Grade 1 First Communion Meeting

On October 19 at 7pm a meeting of Grade 1 and Year One First Holy communion parents was held in the church. The purpose of the meeting was to help parents prepare their children receive the sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist in the spring of 2025. The following five things were emphasized.

- 1. **Attend Sunday Mass.** If receiving Jesus in Holy Communion is wonderful and special, then we would want to at least receive the Eucharist every Sunday. Don't let "being too busy," sports or anything keep you from going to Mass.
- Talk about the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist with your child. The real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist is our belief. We believe that the bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Jesus. The Eucharist is not a symbol or a sign, but Jesus truly present. Teach your child our parish prayer for this year.
- Go to Confession as a Family: Aside from practicing how to go
 to confession with a child, families should practice actually going to
 confession. Parents are the first educators of their children when it
 comes to our Faith. However, the best way to really teach children
 about the Faith is to practice it by living it out in our everyday lives.
- Pray Together: Aside from all the talking, reading, and practicing, the most essential step in preparing children - and ourselves! - is prayer. Through prayer, we join in an intimate conversation with God. Parents should pray with and for their children, asking God to prepare him or her for these great Sacraments.
- Use magazines "God's Gift Together- Reconciliation" and "God's Gift Together- Eucharist" to prepare at home for sacraments of Penance and Holy Eucharist.


