

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN & COMMITMENT WEEKEND FOLLOW UP

A special thank you to the 1,000+ parish families and HCA supporters who made financial contributions to the Growing Our Legacy of Faith Capital Campaign. To date we have received 98% of our identified parish needs!

This week the building committee received the estimated costs for the HCA expansion and they are under review by the diocesan construction office. The scope includes the cost of replacing the school's outdated, 25 year-old, heating and cooling system.

On November 9th and 10th, we will be holding "Commitment Days" at HCA. We are requesting that HCA families turn in their pledge cards, to the capital campaign table that will be set up in the lobby during these two days of Parent/Teacher conferences.

Why should all families help?

Typically a small amount of pledges, 5-10% that do not get fulfilled during a five-year campaign, because people move, struggle financially or go home to Jesus. So, we hope to ensure the parish has enough for all projects. A pledge is a good faith commitment to help our parish family, it is not a binding contract.

If all families join this effort then those who struggle will be supported by their fellow parishioners.

Veterans's Day

On the eleventh hour of the eleventh day in the eleventh month of the year 1918, an armistice was signed, ending the "war to end all wars." This year we celebrate the 100th Anniversary of the signing of that armistice.

November 11 was set aside as Armistice Day in the United States to remember the sacrifices that men and women made during the war in order to ensure a lasting peace. In 1938 Congress voted Armistice Day as a legal holiday, but World War II began the following year. Armistice Day was still observed after the end of the Second World War. In 1953 townspeople in Emporia, Kansas called the holiday Veterans' Day in gratitude to the veterans in their town. Soon after, Congress passed a bill renaming the national holiday to Veterans' Day. Today, we remember in our prayers all those who have served for our country in the armed forces.

Dear Lord, today we honor our veterans. worthy men and women who gave their best when they were called upon to serve and protect their country. We pray that you will bless them, Lord, for their unselfish service in the continual struggle to preserve our freedoms, our safety, and our country's heritage, for all of us. National Vocation Awareness Week November 5 - November 11

National Vocation Awareness Week (NVAW) is an annual week-long celebration of the Catholic Church in the United States dedicated to promote vocations to the priesthood, diaconate and consecrated life through prayer and education, and to renew our prayers and support for those who are considering one of these particular vocations. NVAW began in 1976 when the United States Bishops designated the 28th Sunday of the year for NVAW. In 1997, this celebration was moved to coincide with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord in January. Beginning in 2014, NVAW was moved to the first full week of November.

"National Vocation Awareness Week will be celebrated in our country November 5-11, 2023. Please ask Our Lord for more dedicated, holy priests, deacons and consecrated men and women. May they be inspired by Jesus Christ, supported by our faith community, and respond generously to God's gift of a vocation." (usccb. org/vocations).
