

#### Catechists Have the Most Beautiful Feet! From Catechist's Journey

The First Reading for Mass Christmas Day proclaims:

"How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of him who brings glad tidings, announcing peace, bearing good news, announcing salvation, and saying to Zion, "Your God is King!" (Isaiah 52:7)



I've said this before here on Catechist's Journey, but it bears repeating: catechists have the most beautiful feet! Why? Because catechists are the ones who, day in and day out, bring glad tidings, announce peace, bear good news, and announce salvation to those they teach. What do each of these mean in practical terms?

- **Catechists bring glad tidings.** Some tidings (news) cause fear, while other tidings cause sadness. The tidings that catechists announce bring joy and gladness another word for delight. And what are those tidings? That God is with us!
- **Catechists announce peace.** Peace is the reality that happens when God's will and human wills intersect. Catechists announce peace by announcing that God is with us and that his will is accessible.
- atechists bear good news. Catechists bring the good news that God is near to us! And we don't just bring it; we "bear it," which means that we embody it.
- **Catechists announce salvation.** Catechists do not announce selfimprovement; we announce salvation! And this sal-vation comes to us as a Person: Jesus Christ, who is not just a wise man, a good teacher, or a deep philosopher. He is our Savior, the One who saves us from that over which we have no power: sin (separation from God).

#### And so, as we celebrate the glorious Feast of the Nativity of our Lord, Jesus Christ, I once again thank you—all catechists—for your beautiful feet! Christmas Blessings!

#### **How to Prepare**

In preparation for a Consecration to the Holy Family, your family should not only decide to dedicate itself to the Holy Family's intercession but also acknowledge that the family is sacred.

The decision to consecrate your family needs to be intentional and a process through which you completely surrender to God through the Holy Family. You are accepting the truth that salvation history was changed forever by a family, and that through your domestic church, you are called to live their example.

#### Four suggested steps before praying the Consecration to the Holy Family:

Discuss the importance of this consecration as a family and why you are doing it.

Each member of your family is strongly encouraged to go to the sacrament of reconciliation.



As a family, intentionally choose something to fast from. The fast can be for at least a week. As our physical bodies are drawn to things of the world, it is strongly encouraged that you fast from something that you would normally do or consume. Fasting helps to discipline our minds and hearts to refrain from secular activities and be more focused on God.



Prepare for the commitment you are making. Consecration to the Holy Family is not a single event. You have chosen a way of life for your family. You and your family are consciously choosing to be a beacon of light of God's love through his Church.


