**CROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY FOR THE EXPANSION OF HCA!** On Saturday, April 20th, just before 7pm, Fr. Mosimann stood with the following altar servers, Matthew Esposito, Noah Harring, Cam Hicks, Ryan Kimbrell, Grace Murphy, Theresa Murphy, John Owen, Nathan Riley, and Artie Rolfs near the tent decorated with maroon and gold balloons, HCA colors, in front of the Holy Cross baseball backstop.

The Groundbreaking Ceremony began with Brian Fannin, past PTO President of HCA, and VP of Parish Council, acting as master of ceremonies. Lift High the Cross was the opening song and Fr. Renner lead the Opening Prayer as a prelude to remarks by invited guests for the official Groundbreaking of HCA.

Fr. Mosimann, shared very lovingly, about the theme of the parish and of HCA during the campaign: "*Nothing is Impossible for God*" and how it inspired him as a pastor to want to give everyone at St. Mary the same kind of attention and love that he showers on his family and all of his nieces and nephews.

Dr. Stephen Fry, HCA Principal, Mike Hamann, V. P. of Wack General Contractor, and Donna Harring and Mary Owen, Co-Chairs of the Capital Campaign also shared remarks. All were exuberant and thanked everyone who lovingly supports our parish and Holy Cross Academy.

Looking out into the crowd, it was amazing to see all of the HCA kids and the many adults who had their orange construction shirts on in an attempt to surprise Fr. Mosimann! Brian led everyone gathered around the site of the Groundbreaking to pray a *Hail Mary* in thanksgiving to *Our Lady*. There was much joy and anticipation!

Fr. Mosimann led the "Prayer of Blessing" as several of the altar servers held lighted torches and the Cross. Father then sprinkled the ground behind the elementary school with holy water! Next, & Stella Freeland, William Waters, Pres. of HCA's Student Council, assisted by his special friend, kindergartener, Niam Haltah. Groundbreakers also included our pastor, Fr. Mosimann, principal, Dr. Steve Fry, Angie Tomayko, Vice-Principal of HCA, Teresa Waineo, VP of the HCA PTO, Kevin Breen, Finance Committee, and Dr. Leroy Essig, who ran the first Capital Campaign to build Holy Cross Academy 25 years ago!

Brian then counted down " 5,4,3, 2,1, and shouted: "Go Crusaders!" All the groundbreakers picked up their shovels and lifted the dirt!! As everyone took pictures, the groundbreakers placed 16 letters into the ground: All the kids and their families cheered loudly seeing that it spelled out, the name of our parish school: HOLY CROSS ACADEMY!



As everyone cheered, Fr. Mosimann joyfully brought the groundbreaking ceremony to a close. The *HCA choir* stood one last time and sang *God Bless America!* As the sun set, *Crusader and parish families mingled*. They then gathered to watch the fireworks, generously donated, to celebrate not just the 25th Anniversary of HCA but a successful campaign, making *the Holy Cross Academy Expansion for our kids possible!*


