

from our pastor

Dear folks,

This past week you may have seen a deacon at Mass. Some Masses he served as a deacon, and others he came out to help distribute Holy Communion. Deacon Tim Banach is a transitional deacon, who is finishing his last year of studies at Saint Charles Borromeo Seminary in Philadelphia. This is the same seminary I graduated from, and it is great to have another man from St. Charles in the house! As an aside, the 'transitional' adjective in front of 'deacon' is the Church's way of identifying that he is

in formation to be ordained a priest. This is in contrast to 'permanent' deacons who are not on a path to priesthood.

There are three promises made by the transitional deacon during his ordination Mass: to pray the Liturgy of the Hours, Obedience and Celibacy.

- 1. To pray the Liturgy of the Hours for the people of God. Prayer is at the heart of a life of service. This prayer, consists of psalms, petitions, and reading from both Scripture and Church fathers. Through this prayer, the clergy of the Church are praying at every hour of the day for the Church.
- 2. Obedience. To be ordained is to be configured to Jesus Christ. Thus, in obedience, the clergy live and make present the self-emptying love of Our Lord. It is through generously living this, that the bishop is able to care for the souls entrusted to him. How can a preist know he is doing God's will? When he obeys the directives of the bishop, and serves in harmony with him.
- 3. Celibacy. This is what most gets people's attention. Living celibacy generously is a great witness to the Kingdom of God! Here is a snippet of the ordination rite as pertains to celibacy:

By your own free choice, you seek to enter the order of deacons.... By living in this state with total dedication...you will adhere more easily to Christ with an undivided heart; you will be more freely at the service of God and mankind, and you will be more untrammeled in the ministry of Christian conversion and rebirth. By your life and character you will give witness to your brothers and sisters in faith that God must be loved above all else, and that it is He whom you serve in others.

Deacon Tim will be with us for about 9 weeks this summer, and will also be back for Christmas and Holy Week! This adds a new joy to our parish taking part in the formation of future priests. Thank you for the warm welcome that I know you will extend to him.

Deacon Tim is a transitional deacon studying for the Diocese of Arlington at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in Philadelphia. His home parish is St. Charles in Clarendon, where he worked as a technology consultant before answering the call to study to become a priest. As a seminarian, he has served on pastoral assignments at St. Ambrose Parish in Annandale and St. John the Evangelist Parish in Warrenton. A native of Corning, NY, he moved to Virginia to study Systems Engineering at the University of Virginia (class of 2016). He entered the seminary for the Diocese of Arlington in 2019 and was ordained to the transitional diaconate on April 6th, 2024.

Deacon Tim is an avid outdoorsman; feel free to ask him about fishing, skiing, or climbing mountains. His favorite saint is Saint Mother Teresa, who he has had a devotion to since 2014 when he travelled to Kolkata, India to volunteer with the Missionary of Charity Sisters. This experience, combined with many priestly rolemodels in the Diocese of Arlington, contributed to his vocation to the priesthood.



Catechesis Within the Family

While the catechesis offered within the family is ordinarily informal, unstructured, and spontaneous, it is no less crucial for the development of the child's faith. In a certain sense nothing replaces family catechesis, especially for its positive and receptive environment, for the example of adults, and for its first explicit experience and practice of the faith. The catechesis of infants and young children nourishes the beginnings of the life of faith.

Parents have shared the gift of human life with their children and, through Baptism, have enriched them with a share in God's own life. They have the duty to nourish it. Their faith, their attitude toward other human beings, and their trust in a loving God strongly influence the development of the child's faith. Parents are catechists precisely because they are parents. Their role in the formation of Christian values in their children is irreplaceable. They should speak naturally and simply about God and their faith, as they do about other matters they want their children to understand and appreciate.

Parents are also the most effective catechists of prayer for their young children. They know what their children are capable of understanding and can easily teach their children basic prayers and the fundamental attitude of prayer. By praying frequently with their children at special moments during the day and especially by praying with them at the Sunday Eucharist, parents introduce children into the prayer life of the Church. By incorporating prayer into everyday family experiences, parents teach their children by example. Their witness encourages their children to call upon God as their Father who loves and protects them; to look to Jesus, their Savior and brother, who leads them to the Father; and to acknowledge the presence of the Holy Spirit, who dwells within their hearts.

Children ordinarily enjoy listening to their parents read to them and tell them stories. Reading stories from Sacred Scripture combines both these simple activities. Just as children learn their family histories through stories told by their parents, they learn about the Catholic faith as their parents introduce them to the person of Jesus and the beauty of the word of God and tell them the story of Mary, the mother of God, as well as of the lives of the saints. usccb.org/beliefs-and-teachings/whowe-teach/children
