Dear folks,

Do your lives slow down a little bit in the summer? I picked up a bad cough on the Poland trip, so that is making me slow down a little bit this week. Sorry to those I had to reschedule appointments.

My one simple thought this week: "How do you learn to pray the Mass?" My answer to that has always been, "go when you don't have to."

See, I learned to pray the Mass when I went to Saturday morning Masses with my parents. They went faithfully every Saturday morning, and had breakfast afterwards with friends. I learned that if I got up and went to Mass with them, that I too would be able to go to Bob's Big Boy. (Yes, that was the name of a restaurant chain in the 70's.)

Yes, I may have been going to for the opportunity to order a root beer with my breakfast eggs! But I learned so much more about Mass, and how the rhythm of daily Mass differs from Sundays.

Let me make this analogy: Do you only eat on Sundays when the whole extended family gathers at grandmas for a feast? Sunday Mass is that thanksgiving feast of the whole family! But daily Masses are the regular daily bread for feeding our souls, just as the 6.5 days of nutrition are an essential part of nutrition.

Feed your souls. And doing so freely, without the compulsion of punishment for failure is the way to root our spiritual lives in the freedom of the children of God.

Oh yeah.... I also listened to a podcast about forming habits, that said to keep the goals small and easily achievable. The emotional feedback of achieving the goal is what sets it into our routine and makes it a habit! This is why I say, "Go to one Mass during the week that you don't have to (Sundays/HolyDays), and you will change your spiritual life."

Once the application is accepted, you will receive a link in your email from opcyp@arlingtondiocese.org (check your spam folder).

Second, Virtus training must be completed within 45 days of application acceptance.

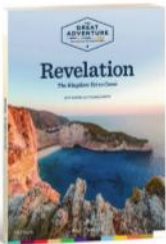

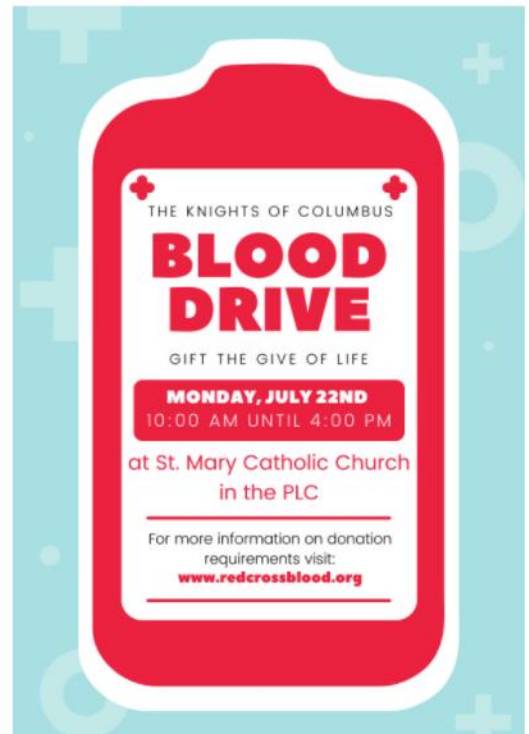

Diocesan Missionary Cooperative Appeal

Diocesan Mission Apostolate in Banica July 27 & 28

"Unless the mission is oriented by charity, that is, unless it springs from a profound act of divine love, it risks being reduced to mere philanthropic and social activity... Consequently, being missionaries means loving God with all one's heart, even to the point, if necessary, of dying for him." - Pope Benedict XVI

This year the Diocesan Missionary Cooperative Appeal is being made for the Arlington Diocese Dominican Republic Mission Apostolate.

During his pontificate, Pope John XXIII encouraged dioceses with sufficient numbers of priests to share them with dioceses that had limited numbers of priests. Bishop Keating, second bishop of the Diocese of Arlington, listened to the Pope's request and established the Arlington Dominican Mission in 1991. Bishop Keating was also considering the well-being of Arlington by providing the diocese with a mission experience. Thus, a more impoverished part of the world could receive much needed material goods, the faithful of Virginia could experience a sister church in a developing country, and the priests who would return from this mission land could better serve the growing number of Spanish-speaking Catholics in Northern Virginia. Since 1991, the Arlington Dominican Mission has served 70 communities in the Dominican Diocese of San Juan de la Maguana.

The Diocese assigns its missions in the Dominican Republic to each parish in the Diocese once every three years. Two of our Diocesan priests, Father Stephen McGraw and Father Scott Sina are currently on assignment at the parishes of San Francisco De Asis in Banica and San José in Pedro Santana. To assist the priests in their spiritual formation, there is a dedicated cadre of catechists who work daily with parishioners. In addition to this, the priests and catechists attend to myriad of societal and physical needs such as ensuring access to potable water, medical care, food distribution and most especially education. The Parish School now educates 250 children from Kindergarten through eighth grade. Even in 2023 Banica is still very rural. Cell

phone and internet service is available but very inconsistent. Clean water is not readily available throughout the area. The 30 years of the Mission in Banica has and will continue to assist the parishioners through our financial support, our prayers, and our physical presence.

Father Sina will be here to speak about the Banica Mission and your generous response to this Appeal is sincerely appreciated. All checks should be made payable to the parish, with Mission Appeal in the memo line. God bless you.

Children's Charity - July

Children's Offertory Contributions for the month of July will be donated to Families of the Wounded Fund. This fund was created in 2005 to help the families of service members who came to McGuire Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Richmond with traumatic brain injuries and spinal-cord injuries from combat in Iraq and Afghanistan. Former Army Captain William Haneke, a wounded Vietnam Veteran, and some colleagues recognized the need to assist family members who were away from home tending to their loved ones when they saw two young mothers with babies arrive from across the country with no money and barely enough gas to make the trip. The organization gives 100 percent of all tax-deductible donations to the families to help with food, lodging, transportation, child care, diapers and long-distance calling cards during the many weeks a family is in the Central Virginia area while a veteran is being treated. Each family who qualifies currently receives \$9,000. For more information, visit their website at fotwf.org.

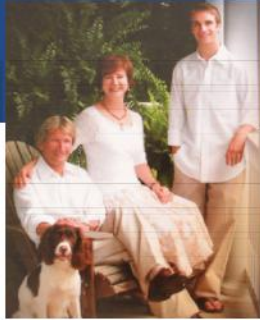
