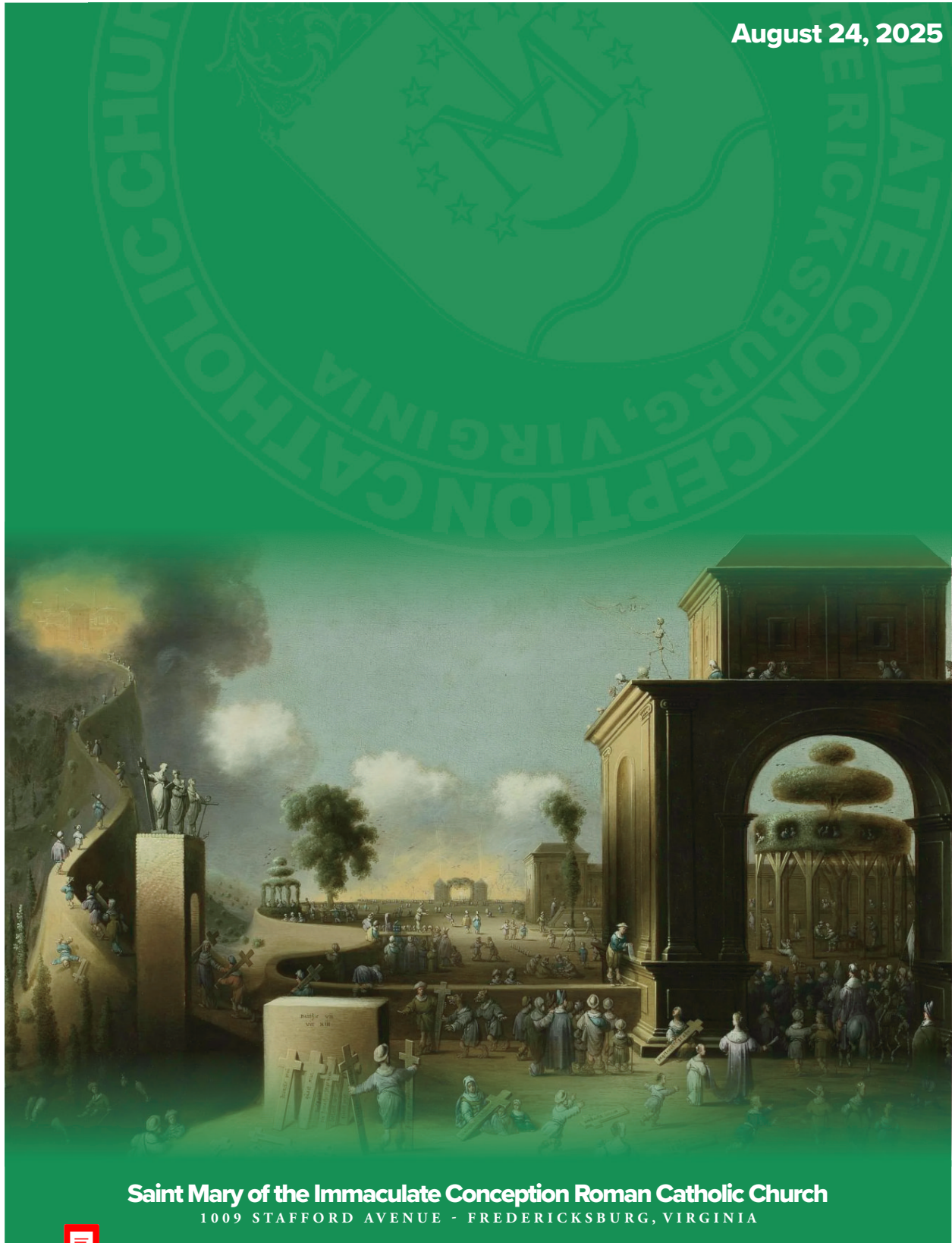

SAINT MARY KEY PRIORITIES/ PROJECTS

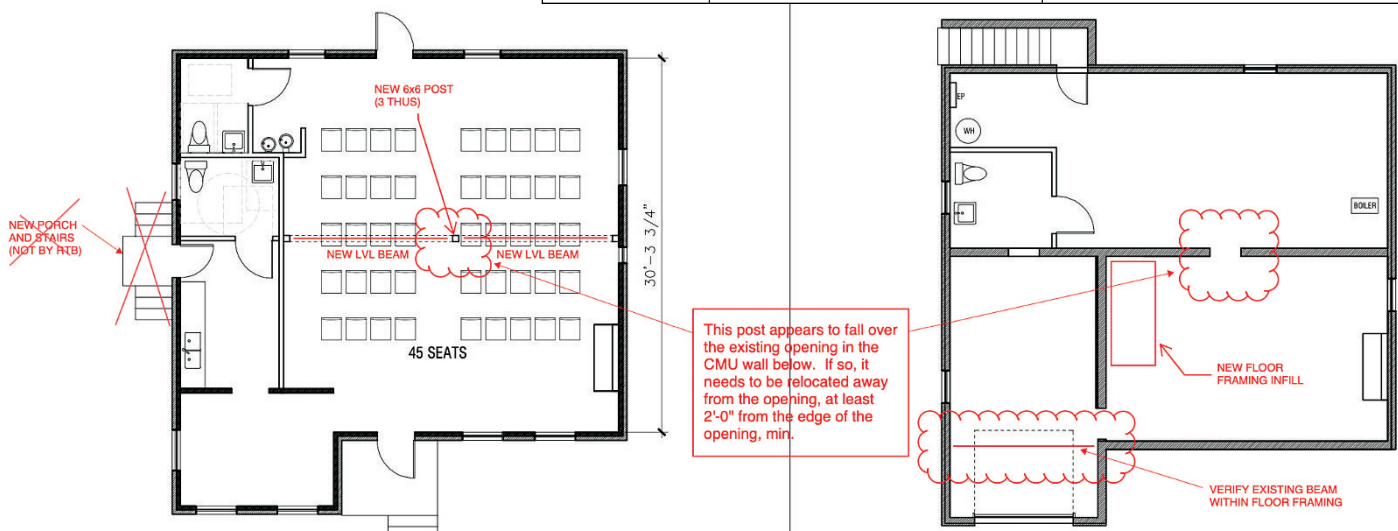
With thankful hearts and the belief that Nothing is Impossible for God, we are so pleased and grateful that the improvements to our parish campus are beginning!

PROJECT	DESCRIPTION	STATUS
Sidewalks	Four sidewalks to be added to the Parish Campus to meet compliance standards, facilitating permanent occupancy of the St. Joseph House.	Two of the four sidewalks have been completed, and the remaining two require further work.
St Nicholas House	The property is slated for comprehensive renovation, which will include the development of additional meeting spaces to support St. Mary Ministries.	Content from the St. Nicholas House has been moved. Demolition is in progress. Kitchen cabinets, countertops, and flooring are being ordered. Diagram provided below. Upper-level will be used for meeting space, while lower level for storage.
Courtyard Meeting Room	The courtyard meeting room will be renovated to create the Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel, facilitating prayer and the celebration of the Sacraments.	Renovation work on the courtyard meeting room is slated to begin in the next few weeks. Ministry and Adult Education meetings are being relocated to make the space ready.
Sanctuary	Improvement to the Sanctuary will provide needed seating for the priest and altar servers.	Millwork is starting on the back wall of the Sanctuary in the Church, and seating is being added.
Parish Life Center	Move the preschool out of the Parish Life Center and update the Kitchen.	The pre-school has been moved to HCA. The team has secured estimates for replacing the two ovens, cooktops, and dishwasher.
Rectory	Remodeling the Rectory to accommodate guests and Seminarians will provide a comfortable and welcoming place to stay.	The design for the rectory is still a work in progress. We're going back and forth with the architect, making sure we get the plans exactly right.



from our pastor

Dear Folks,

With the celebration of the Feast of the Assumption, I invite you to consider three things:

— Have you noticed that this feast has an octave of sorts?

The eighth day after the Assumption is the Feast of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Imagine the scene: Mary arrives in heaven to great celebration, then settles into her heavenly home to prepare for her coronation as Queen of Heaven and Earth a week later!

— Do you ever wonder how Mary can pay attention to all of her children?

I think anxieties like this may stem from a lack of imagination. Scripture says, “Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, what has not entered the human heart, what God has ready for those who love Him.” (1 Cor 2:9) Our imaginations about what is fitting or possible must not—and cannot—limit the Lord’s plans! These feasts invite us to stretch our imagination heavenward.

— Sometimes people pull back from the practice of the faith with the phrase, “I’m spiritual, not religious.”

But this misunderstands what religion truly is: the rendering to God what is His due—thanksgiving and worship. Thanksgiving, because everything we have and are is a gift from Him.

Worship, because to worship God is to acknowledge His excellence and perfection, and to render Him the honor due as the Author of all things.

To refuse Him thanks and worship is to refuse to respond rightly as a creature to the Creator.

We cannot fashion the universe according to our own design; that kind of mysticism makes no demands on us. But the Gospel does make demands—on how we live, act, and love. So live in wonder and awe at the mysteries He has revealed.

MONDAY-WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 8-10

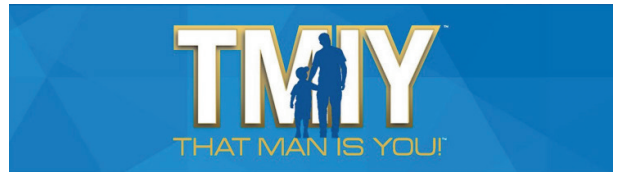


This month

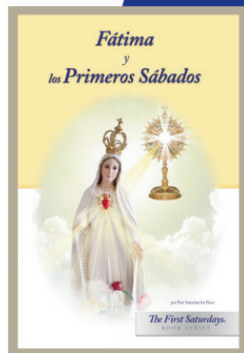

Stafford Junction's programs prioritize education, nutrition, and healthy living. 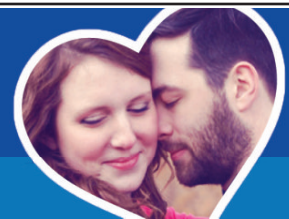

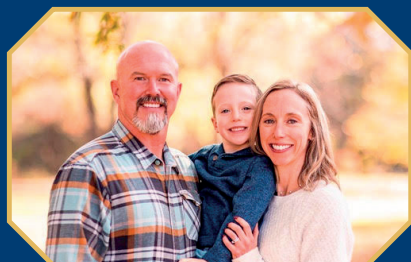
