

HCA OPEN HOUSE: "NOTHING IS IMPOSSIBLE FOR GOD!"

The halls of Holy Cross Academy came alive with a sense of adventure at the St. Mary Parish Picnic as HCA students led parishioners on a *Scavenger Hunt* to tour the newly added 12,285 square feet to our parish school. 1,100 scavenger hunt booklets were passed out. It was each visitor's passport to all the new and unseen spaces completed during the expansion project.

First on the hunt was the St. Helena Chapel, where visitors received a prayer card of St. Helena of the Cross blessed by Bishop Burbidge. The position of the chapel shows all who enter HCA, that "Christ is at the center of our school and is at the heart of our mission, teaching and living our Faith!. Next, our student guides led our visitors to see the



two new Pre-School rooms. Guests made their way into the school's brand new cafeteria through a pretty, glow-worthy, "Adventure Orange Hallway." A nod to our pastor, Father Mosimann's childhood love of the color orange! Thanks be to God!!

At the event, attendees were invited to find their brick on the Donor Wall, where a 90" TV showed off a fun photo montage of the expansion. For some added fun, guests tried to guess how many bricks were etched into the wall. While many came close, only two people, Damian Deitchman and Paul Cronquist, guessed the **exact** number: 827! Their reward for this impressive feat was a beautiful wooden box featuring an image of the stained glass Annunciation window from the St. Helena Chapel.

At each station, a stamp or small prize was given. The *scavenger hunt* showed guests the

cafeteria's upgraded kitchen and the new and improved Stem Classroom. In the newly constructed middle school wing Science Lab, *all participants took part* in a "sweet experiment" launching an actual marshmallow from a 3D catapult! The object was not to hit the wall! Visitors went on to try their skill at solving a math problem in Honors Math and to identify five Spanish-speaking Countries in the new Foreign Language classroom.

The scavenger hunt finished outside our school's bigger and better playground, complete with soft, green astro turf and beautiful new sidewalks! After completing the tour and earning a stamp at each newly constructed space, guests were greeted by Dr. Stephen Fry, and their names were put into a raffle. One parishioner commented, "So amazing to think that all of this was completed in just 14 months!" It is truly such a wonderful improvement for our kids!! Because of your support, the HCA expansion is now a reality. Delivered on time and as designed! This new space is more than just bricks and mortar; it's a place where our students will learn, grow, and thrive for generations to come.

Dear Folks,

Why is the baptismal font in the vestibule??

It's part of the work to expand the platform where the priests now sit.

Once Jesus was returned to the center of the church, we began plans to replace the cabinetry that previously held the tabernacle with seating for servers. That work was completed last month. (And everyone who asked about it said, "Oh, I didn't notice a difference.") That's the goal—to keep your eyes on **Jesus!**

The next step is to make the seating for the priest, deacon, and servers more **spacious and safe**. Currently, the chairs are precariously close to the stairs. Enlarging the platform will bring the church into more symmetrical uniformity and will also make things safer for clergy and servers during Mass.

To do this, we need to slightly **move the baptismal font forward**, and build up a wall and platform that will be well-anchored and secure. This is why the baptismal font has been temporarily relocated to the **narthex**. It should be returning to its place—hopefully—within days of your reading this.

Honestly, the goal is that these changes be **subtle improvements**, mostly unnoticed by the average Sunday Mass attendee.

Oh yeah... Parish Life Weekend!

If you're reading this in church, I exhort you to **stop by one of the ministry tables this weekend**. Our ability to accomplish the great works of the Lord depends on each of us generously lending a hand.

Annual Life Chain 2-3:30pm

What is a Life Chain?

The first Life Chain, born through prayer, was built in 1987 by Please Let Me Live, a small pro-life ministry in Yuba City, California. From its small beginning, the Life Chain has grown to over 1,800 Life Chains in the United States and Canada, and is a call to the Christian Church to mobilize against an abortion holocaust that has claimed over 65 million lives worldwide, through surgical abortion. The Life Chain is a peaceful, prayerful, silent demonstration. Hundreds of Christians - clergy and lay people -- stand 25 to 50 feet apart to form a prayer chain and hold signs reading Abortion Kills Children, Jesus Forgives and Heals, Adoption: The Loving Option, Lord, Forgive Us and Our Nation, Life: The First Inalienable Right. This powerful, visual impact not only raises community awareness but has also been credited with saving children's lives. Consider the words of Pope Saint John Paul II who said, "When life before birth is attacked, we will stand up. No one ever has the authority to destroy unborn human life."

St. Mary Parish will again participate in the Annual Life Chain on Sunday, October 5 and welcomes all our parishioners and local churches as well. We will meet in front of the Parish Life Center at 1:45pm to pick up our signs and walk up to Emancipation Highway (Route 1), where we will form a chain along Route 1 from Stafford Avenue to College Avenue. Please join us and take a stand for the unborn.





A new Catholic Burial Garden has been established in the Diocese of Arlington 30 minutes East of downtown Fredericksburg on Route 301 in Historyland Memorial Park and Arboretum in King George County.

The Garden is a cooperative arrangement with Historyland and the Parish of St. Elizabeth of Hungary in Colonial Beach & St. Anthony of Padua in King George.

Every grave is required to have a headstone which will face East, the traditional direction of Christian burial, awaiting the Coming of the Lord on the Day of Resurrection.


