

Growing Our Legacy of Faith

Servant of God, Michael McGivney

Servant of God Michael McGivney was born in 1852 to Irish parents. He became a priest for the Hartford Archdiocese in Connecticut. In 1882, at the age of 29, he established the Knights of Columbus as a lay organization to unite Catholic men and to protect the families of deceased members. In 2008, Pope Benedict XVI declared him a "Venerable Servant of God" because of his many heroic virtues. Then in 2020, Pope Francis approved a miracle due to Father McGivney's intercession, and this cleared the way to his cause for sainthood. In 1890, he died of pneumonia while caring for those suffering from an epidemic of it. Many years later,



the principles at the center of the Knights of Columbus, the organization he founded, continue to be charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. Michael Mcgivney was beatified on October 31, 2020, and this feast day is celebrated in his honor, each year, by the Knights of Columbus.

All Saints Day on Saturday! The great feast of All Saints falls on Saturday this year. Because of that, the obligation to attend Mass under pain of sin has been lifted. 
SAINTS PARADE THIS FRIDAY!

WorkCamp Adult Volunteer Needs

CONTRACTORS
