

Great news! Construction for the Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel is moving forward quickly!

Over the past few weeks, we've hit several key milestones:

- · Demolition of the old flooring and bathroom is complete.
- The mechanical and plumbing trades are now working on infrastructure.
- · A new restroom entryway has been created and will include enhanced soundproofing.
- · Paint and flooring materials have been selected and ordered.
- The exterior doors are being replaced with new windows, which we expect to be installed by mid to late October.
- Some Liturgical Items have been ordered, and many are currently being quoted and then ordered.

Dear Folks.

There has been a bit of confusion over electronic giving.

Here is what happened, our third-party vendor for electronic giving is Faith Direct. Faith Direct migrated its online service to ParishSoft Giving on September 25th. As I understand it, essentially they sub-contracted a portion of their service, which is not unusual for contractors or businesses.

Yes, it was marketed as an upgrade, but not all of you have experienced the transition as such. Here are a few changes:

- Donors will now be receiving email notices from ParishSoft Giving regarding their donations to the parish, before this was something you had to opt into, but it has been turned on by default. Some folks thought these emails were a scam, but they are not. (However, always be careful to never click on links!)
- Donors who give Weekly Offertory as opposed to Monthly Offertory will now have their weekly donation drawn from their account every week. Pray for our bookkeeper, as this means many more entries for our bookeeping software as folks choose different days!
- Donors now need to use the the link below to check their accounts and make any changes to their information. (Didn't I just tell you never click on links? Ooops). And at least one parishioner couldn't get this link to work. (Maybe because of formatting in the bulletin, it may have removed part of the link)? Here is the link on it's own line:



Participants in Promoting the Common Good

September 2025

As Virginia voters, this fall we will elect our next Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Attorney General. We will also decide who will occupy all 100 Virginia House of Delegates seats. Election Day is November 4. Early voting begins September 19.

As the *Catechism* reminds us, "It is necessary that all participate, each according to his position and role, in promoting the common good.... As far as possible, citizens should take an active part in *public life*" (nos. 1913-1915).

To promote the common good, we must form our consciences and vote, recognizing that:

- Many issues are important.
- Not all issues have equal moral weight.
- Protecting life is paramount.

Above all else, addressing the tragedy of abortion is the "pre-eminent priority because it directly attacks our most vulnerable and voiceless brothers and sisters and destroys more than a million lives per year in our country alone" (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, Introductory Note, U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, 2023).

The Virginia Catholic Conference (VCC) has prepared an array of voter education resources to help form consciences and provide timely information. Visit <u>vacatholic.org/Election2025</u> or scan the QR code to view these materials.

We encourage parishes to distribute each of the VCC resources, especially:

- The VCC's Candidate Comparisons in the races for Governor, Lieutenant Governor and Attorney General, which provide the candidates' positions on key issues; and
- The *Proposed Constitutional Amendments: Be Vigilant!* resource, which explains three proposed amendments to Virginia's constitution. These proposals have already moved part of the way through the General Assembly process. One of them would allow virtually unlimited abortion at any stage of pregnancy. The legislators we elect in the House races this November will decide whether these proposed constitutional amendments advance any further.

With so much at stake, we must prepare to engage in this year's critical voting decisions – through conscience formation, prayer and fasting. United in the Eucharist, let us pray for one another and join together as active participants in promoting the common good.

In a May 2025 speech, Sears expressed support for a variety of energy sources: "That's why we are going to have all of it: clean coal. Oil. Yes, renewables. Nuclear. Natural gas; all of that." On X (formerly Twitter) in July 2024, she posted, "Virginia will continue to lead the nation as we innovate and expand our All-the-Above energy approach. We will drive and maintain economic growth as we expand our capability to support the energy needs of a growing Commonwealth."

Spanberger called climate change "one of the greatest and most imminent threats to our economy, our national security, and our way of life." In 2019, Spanberger cosponsored the Climate Action Now Act, which would require "the President to develop and update annually a plan for the United States to meet its nationally determined contribution under the Paris Agreement on climate change." In a 2019 Congressional hearing, she stated, "As Congress looks to strengthen our engagement on issues of international diplomacy, security, and development, climate change must be viewed as a pressing national security concern."

HEALTHCARE

In a 2022 interview, Sears expressed support for increased funding for mental health initiatives, including behavioral health facilities and school support staff. "We've got to find the money; we've got to prioritize," Sears said. "There are things if we don't address them, they are only going to get worse and mental health is absolutely one of them."

According to Spanberger's website, "Abigail believes that all Virginians deserve access to quality, affordable healthcare — and believes in protecting Virginia's Medicaid expansion and defending against efforts to dismantle the *Affordable Care Act*, which protects more than 1.3 million Virginians with pre-existing conditions."

PARENTS' RIGHTS

In a 2022 interview, Sears stated, "Parents want to know that their child is learning. If that is not happening, something needs to be done." She highlighted a bill that Gov. Youngkin signed that requires parental notification before sexually explicit content is presented, permits parental review of the materials, and requires the provision of non-explicit alternatives to any student upon parental request. In reaction to a June 2025 U.S. Supreme Court decision upholding Tennessee's ban on puberty blockers and other so-called gender transition procedures on minors, Sears stated: "The Court got it right: parents have the final say."

In 2023, as a member of Congress, Spanberger voted against the Parents Bill of Rights Act. This bill sought to require schools to notify parents of their right to know what their children are being taught, to address the school board, to see the school budget and spending, and to receive information about violent activity. The bill also specified the right of parents to "know if their child's school operates, sponsors, or facilitates athletic programs or activities that permit an individual whose biological sex is male to participate in an athletic program or activity that is designed for individuals whose biological sex is female" and to "know if their child's school allows an individual whose biological sex is male to use restrooms or changing rooms designated for individuals whose biological sex is female."




