

Pledge Statements:

We will send pledge statements during the first week of December. Please review the statement to ensure accuracy and that our records align with yours.

Please note: Paying your pledge with a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) or with Stock can help reduce your taxes.

A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA (Individual Retirement Account) custodian, payable to a qualified charity. QCD's can be counted toward satisfying your required minimum distributions (RMD's) for the year as long as certain rules are met. If you are over age 72 years, your IRA administrator should advise you that you are required to take minimum distributions from your IRAs.

For payment with stock, you will need to acquire the Catholic Diocese of Arlington Stock Donation Form from the St. Mary Parish office. Clearly state on the form that you wish the transaction to benefit St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception, Growing Our Legacy of Faith Capital Campaign.

Background

I lost my faith and wanted to die.

My name is Anthony D'Ambrosio, and I'm the writer and director of Triumph of the Heart.

I was a good Catholic. I did the right things. I even went to seminary, but I left when I fell in love.

But just before I got engaged, everything fell apart.

I got sick. An undiagnosed medical condition destroyed my life. I couldn't sleep. My relationship ended. I could barely hold down my job. And worst of all, there was no cure—no end in sight.

The darkness closed in, and I lost my faith. I didn't want to live anymore.

But then I remembered Kolbe.

St. Maximilian Kolbe was a priest, a writer, and a Catholic friar. During World War II, he was arrested and sent to Auschwitz for his vocal opposition to the ideologies of the day.

He watched as 10 men were condemned to die in the starvation bunker—a brutal death sentence. When one man cried out, "My wife, my children!" Kolbe stepped forward and offered his own life in exchange.

I kept coming back to that starvation bunker—the place where Kolbe chose to love in the face of unimaginable suffering. I thought about how he forged a brotherhood in that darkness, how he transformed despair into hope. Slowly, a light began to break through.

Kolbe's story gave me a way forward, and this film is my way of sharing that light with the world.

In an age that runs from pain and avoids the cost of love, Kolbe shows us another way. He is a saint for our time—and his story is one we all need to hear.



Parish Christmas Collection for Special Charities - December 6 & 7

As many of you know, every year at Christmas we take up a special collection for charity. None of the money collected stays at St. Mary, but is distributed as a gift from our Parish to different charities. The collection this year will be taken up on December 6 and December 7 and has been designated for the following charities:

The Holy Land Christians Society for the support of the presence of the Christian communities in the Holy Land and for the benefit of the Creche Orphanage in Bethlehem. The orphanage, managed by the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul, has a long history in Bethlehem and has welcomed abandoned children since its foundation in 1884. The Crèche provides services of high quality for Palestinian children and people in the West Bank area and continues to function thanks to the support of its benefactors. In times of crisis and violence, a Christ-like response is paramount. Christians in the Holy Land are the hands and feet of Christ, promoting peace, courage, and love. They are the "living stones" who embody Christ's work in the Holy Land and continued support for their presence is important.

We will also be supporting the Shrine of the Sacred Heart. This beloved church located in NW Washington, DC has been a beacon of hope for immigrants arriving to the United States of America for over 100 years. It has welcomed Polish, Italian, German, South American, and those from Asia and African nations. It is located in a poor neighborhood that is struggling with the recent crackdown on illegal immigrants and its feeding programs have suffered as well as its

weekly offertory. Any financial assistance will be gratefully received.

We know you will be generous, as you have always been, and we thank you for sharing the joy of this holy season with those who are less fortunate. All checks should be made payable to St. Mary.

Children's Charity - December

Children's Offertory Contributions in December will be used for the Brisben Center Shelter for homeless families with children. A significant focus by the shelter is placed on children, ensuring a safe and supportive environment while their families work toward stability, and all donations will help support the needs of the homeless children at the Shelter. Children's Offertory Envelopes are available in the Religious Education Office, and all proceeds from these envelopes go to a different children's charity each month. These envelopes are a way of teaching children the importance of almsgiving and helping those in need, and we encourage you to please consider having your children participate in this very important outreach.
