

Did You Know?

The year 2025 marked St. Therese of Lisieux's 100th year as a saint. That is 100 years of roses from heaven. St. Therese of Lisieux, whose feast day is October 1, is the youngest Doctor of the Church. This Carmelite nun from Lisieux was the youngest child of Sts. Zelie and Louis Martin. Having endured life-threatening illnesses when she was an infant and a child, and the loss of her mother when she was only four, Therese had to overcome crushing adversity with her powerful faith and determination. She sought to enter Carmel while still a young teenager, and achieved this goal at 15. She was not a martyr or a missionary in the traditional sense, but she offered every small act for love of God. Her teachings have spread through her autobiography, <u>Story of a Soul</u>. Therese taught"the little way," which is not about striving for great deeds but rather doing everything even small things, with great love.



St. Therese's Christmas Miracle

Therese was a difficult child. The young, future saint was strong willed and any minor inconvenience or conflict resulted in her crying-a lot. On Christmas in 1886,

St.Therese of Lisieux was changed forever. As she and her family arrived home from Midnight Mass to see their shoes filled with small gifts, she overheard her father talking of how he hoped Therese would soon outgrow this sort of thing. Therese writes in her autobiography that her typical reaction would have included a lot of tears, but the Lord cured of this childishness. She recounts the life-changing event, later calling it her "Christmas Miracle," that occurred when she was 13 years old: "...I was not the same Therese any more; Jesus had changed me completely. I held back my tears, and trying to stop my heart from beating so fast, I ran down into the dining room. I picked up the shoes and unwrapped my presents joyfully, looking all the while as happy as a queen. Father did not look cross anymore now and entered into the fun of it while Celine thought she must have been dreaming. But this was no dream. Therese had gotten back forever the strength of mind she had lost at four-and-half."

100 years of Roses and Memorial Opportunities for the Divine Mercy Chapel

2026 will mark 101 years of roses from heaven as St. Therese, known as the "Little Flower," is known for granting those who request her intercession signs of her assistance by sending them roses. Six beautiful statues of Saints, hand carved by Patrick Demetz a woodcarver from Val Gardenia, Italy will grace the altar of the Divine Mercy Chapel enhancing this sacred space. Her beautiful, hand carving is above.

BLESSED EPIPHANY TO ALL OUR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FAMILIES!

The Feast of the Epiphany celebrates the moment when Jesus is revealed to the whole world, represented by the Magi who followed the star to Bethlehem. Talk with your children today children about the gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh, and what they tell us about who Jesus is – King, God, and Savior. Reflect together on how we, like the Magi, are called to seek Jesus and offer Him our own gifts of love, prayer, and service.

A beautiful Epiphany tradition is the home blessing with chalk, marking your front door with the year and the initials of the Magi (C=Caspar, M=Melchior, B=Balthasar) as a reminder that Christ blesses your home and all who enter. The letters C, M, and B also carry a second meaning: Christus Mansionem Benedicat – "May Christ"

bless this house." The chalk inscription for this year should be written as:

20 + C + M + B + 26

Epiphany is a wonderful opportunity to remind children that Jesus came not just for one people, but for everyone—and that we are sent to share His light with others.

This 2025 Herald Angel spearheads both parish and diocesan works of service

When Donna Harring learned that she had been chosen as the Catholic Herald's 2025 Herald Angel, her reply revealed just why she was nominated. "Can I call you back?" she asked. "I was just on my way to the nursing home to visit the seniors."

Harring has been a parishioner of St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception Church in Fredericksburg for nine years. But in just under a decade, she went on a service spree, serving with parish ministries, the local Legion of Mary curia, the parish capital campaign and parish council, and more recently, the Diocesan Week of Service.

She said her love of service takes root in the Legion of Mary, of which she is treasurer for the Rappahannock Curia, or group of local parish legions. "It gives a good foundation into what it means to be part of the laity and what our responsibilities are as Catholics," she said.

As a member of St. Mary's legion, or praesidium, Harring visits nursing homes in the region weekly. She visits with the seniors, prays the rosary with them, and, this time of year sings Christmas carols with them. "We are basically the eyes and ears for the priests," she said of her service to the elderly.

She is an active member of the Seven Sisters Apostolate, which "goes hand in hand with the Legion of Mary." Through the apostolate, a core group of women takes turns praying a holy hour each day of the week for a specific priest.

"My day is Sunday, so I find an hour and I visit a church." Harring said. "It's such a wonderful blessing that they're giving us their lives ... We need to pray for them."

Harring's professional talent for program management quickly caught the eye of Father John P. Mosimann, pastor, who noticed her detailed spreadsheets on nursing home safety protocols for Legion of Mary volunteers during the pandemic. So, when the parish began its capital campaign in 2022, Father Mosimann knew just who to select as co-chair of

the campaign committee.

"Humble, tireless and amazingly talented," were the three qualities he ascribed to Harring. "If the Lord asks us to do something, he always gives us the grace to accomplish every task. And in order to accomplish the capital campaign at St. Mary's, Donna Harring was the bearer of the perfect skillset to accomplish what the Lord had asked us to do," he said. "She really had the skills to facilitate that vision."

While serving as co-chair, Harring had the opportunity to help facilitate the purchase of the statues and stained glass that would grace the renovated Holy Cross Academy, the parish school, and the new Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel. She said among her favorite pieces of art is a stained-glass window of St. Joseph the Worker with the Child Jesus.

"We were able to raise \$7.3 million," she said of the campaign. "We realized that this is the work of the Holy Spirit. We're just the arms and legs, but the Holy Spirit works in the hearts of everyone."

As if she wasn't busy enough on the parish level, Harring gave her time and talent on a diocesan scale, serving on the committee for the Nov. 9-16 Diocesan Week of Service. Harring helped organize the many service projects conducted by parishes and schools throughout the week. "We created this template, and everybody selected one of those spiritual acts of mercy or corporal acts of mercy," she said, adding that her focus was pro-life projects. Each committee member

assigned to a specific work of mercy was responsible for coordinating parish projects for that category.

"Donna's love for the church and generous sharing of her gifts made her a shining star on the planning committee," said Msgr. Robert C. Cilinski, episcopal vicar of charitable works and pastor of Nativity Catholic Church in Burke. "She spent hours and hours, weeks and weeks, establishing the database that promoted, recorded and received all the parish and school projects results. Donna was the key person that encouraged everyone's input and participation."

She also worked with parishes following the week of service to collect data to pass along to the diocesan communications department. "It was an honor to do it," she said.

Harring gives of herself not only to her parish but also to her family. She has been married 31 years to her husband, David, and is a proud mother to two sons and three grandsons, who attend Holy Cross Academy.

"It's wonderful to have daughters-inlaw," she said.

Reflecting on why she continues to serve, Harring said it always goes back to the mission of the Legion of Mary, "to bring souls closer to Christ."

"There's so much joy in giving of ourselves and knowing it is for God."





First Offering Contributions to Help Offset Cost of Collection Envelopes

Each year in January the envelope packet always includes an envelope marked "First Offering" with a suggested donation of \$15.00. This is not a regular collection, but merely a request for a free-will offering to help offset the cost of the printing and bimonthly mailing of collection envelopes to more than 5,000 parish families. From July 2024 to June 2025, the parish's cost for the offering envelopes was \$30,961.19. First Offering donations received for the same period totaled \$5,185.00. Your generosity and support in helping to offset the cost of the envelopes is greatly appreciated.

Children's Charity - January

Camp Rainbow, sponsored by Mary Washington Healthcare Grief Support Services, is a day camp for children who are coping with the loss of a loved one. Camp Rainbow provides a path for child campers along their journey through grief and toward healing. Little Buddies (child participants) are paired with trained Big Buddies (adult volunteers) to explore their feelings through age-appropriate crafts, activities, discussions and one-on-one time. Expressive therapies such as art, music and dance are used to assist children with their grief and are balanced with traditional camp activities, like arts and crafts, kayaking, and singing by the fire. Children's Offertory Envelopes are available in the Religious Education Office and are a wonderful way for children to learn about helping those in need. All proceeds from these envelopes go to a different children's charity each month.

This year's March will be held on Friday, January 23rd to commemorate the 53rd Anniversary of Roe v. Wade. Although Roe v. Wade has been overturned, there is still work to be done, and the March for Life will continue to take place every January until a culture of life is restored in the United States of America. Please plan to join your parish family in this peaceful protest against abortion.



A new Catholic Burial Garden has been established in the Diocese of Arlington 30 minutes East of downtown Fredericksburg on Route 301 in Historyland Memorial Park and Arboretum in King George County.

The Garden is a cooperative arrangement with Historyland and the Parish of St. Elizabeth of Hungary in Colonial Beach & St. Anthony of Padua in King George.

Every grave is required to have a headstone which will face East, the traditional direction of Christian burial, awaiting the Coming of the Lord on the Day of Resurrection.

This Catholic burial place is bounded on two sides by a lovely forest and is laid out in a traditional pattern with walkways, benches and plantings.

At the entrance there is a newly erected brick and wrought iron gate with an arch bearing the name of the Garden in Latin: Coemeterium Sancta Trinitas.

Preplanning for that difficult time is a gift to you and your family. Purchase your burial plot now in the Catholic Garden, Coemeterium Sancta Trinitas.


