Construction Update:

We give thanks to our Lord Jesus for the continued work that is being done on the Divine Mercy chapel on our Parish campus. Last week, liturgical pendants were installed to brighten up the space and enhance its sacredness. The Building Committee is very happy to report that they are a dramatic improvement for prayer and worship. Work continues on the side wall which was reconfigured to house the five niches. The rough-in electrical wiring was installed this week so these can be backlit for the stained glass.

Pope Francis' Five Fruits of Eucharistic Adoration Continued:

Pope Francis emphasizes Eucharistic adoration as a vital, often neglected silent prayer that transforms believers by nourishing them with Jesus' life. Key elements include, a deeper union with Christ, the calming of the heart, increased hope, the curing of spiritual hunger, and the transformation of the soul towards holiness. The five main fruits derived from Pope Francis' teachings on this topic are:

The Importance of Adoration For Our Time: Healing the "Hunger" in the Heart: The Eucharist satisfies our deep hunger for hope, truth, and salvation that cannot be filled by worldly things.

Adoration Helps Us Understand Our Lives Better: A Transformation into Holiness: Just as one gets a tan by standing in the sun, standing before Jesus in the Eucharist transforms believers and makes them holy, a point the Holy Father often referenced and is rooted in the thoughts of Saint Carlo Acutis.

Adoration Is How We Embrace Incarnation: The pontiff writes: "Let us rediscover adoration, for to adore is not to waste time, but to make our time a dwelling-place for God. It is to let the seed of the Incarnation of Jesus bloom within us; It is to cooperate in the work of the Lord, who, like leaven, changes the world. To adore is to intercede, to make reparation, to allow God to realign history."

Adoration Is How We Discover God's Limitless Love: The Pope explains that through adoration, we can concretely understand God's love for us. "In worshipping God, we rediscover that we are free. That is why the Scriptures associate the love the Lord with the fight against every form of idolatry," the Pope continued. "May the Church adore: in every diocese, in every parish, in every community, let us adore the Lord! Only in this way will we turn to Jesus and not to ourselves. For only through silent adoration will the Word of God live in our words; only in his presence will we be purified, transformed and renewed by the fire of his Spirit. Brothers and sisters, let us adore the Lord Jesus!"

Adoration is a Path to Evangelization: According to Pope Francis, Adoration is the fuel for evangelizing. The pontiff said, "When we remain in contact with the face of Christ, seeking Him in the Scriptures and contemplating Him in silent adoration before the tabernacle, we come to see him in the faces of those we serve and experience an interior joy that, even amid hardship, brings peace to our hearts." The Pope told the bishops and clergy in Mongolia during his visit to the country in September 2023, the following: "A Christian is one who is capable of adoration, that is, worshipping in silence. And then, out of this adoration springs activity." During his visit at World Youth Day 2023, the Pope said that St. Mother Teresa [of Calcutta,] busy about so many things in life, never neglected adoration of Our Lord Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, even when the Lord allowed her to go through an interior darkness, like many great saints do, and our Lord's light and love remained hidden from her for some time. Thanks be to God!

from our pastor

Dear Folks,

Snow, ice, sleet, and more ice! And maybe more this weekend too?

As I type this, our parish parking lot is an ice rink. I have to give a shoutout to Fr. Dansereau—he's been out there shoveling and breaking up the ice with an iron digging bar! All but one of the priests joined him in the effort (and that one has a finicky back... so he gets mercy!).

Thanks to all who helped pull off the "bonus Saturday evening Mass at HCA" with just a few hours' notice, and who got the word out. Attendance last Saturday evening rivaled Christmas Eve—both at the church and the school!

Let me take a moment to give a refresher on the moral obligation of Mass attendance:

First, here is the official text from the Catechism, "**The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin.**"

Second, notice that it all flows from Sunday Mass being the "foundation and confirmation" of all we do. If we truly believe and live this, then everything else falls into place. When we can't attend Mass due to a serious reason, we miss it—we long for it.

Third, does a snowstorm qualify for "unless excused for a serious reason." I'm actually grateful that the Church doesn't try to define every situation, because local circumstances vary. Put simply: if it is dangerous for you to travel to Mass,

then neither God nor I, your pastor, want you to endanger your life. That qualifies as a serious reason. However, if you somehow manage to get out to Starbucks or the movie theater... well, sorry: unexcused absence.

Fourth: "illness and care of infants" are specifically mentioned! These are clearly high on the list of legitimate reasons to miss Mass.

Fifth, it also says: "or dispensed by their own pastor." That's right—I can legitimately lift the Sunday obligation for you. So my opinion on what constitutes a serious reason actually carries canonical weight!

Sixth, imagine you can't visit your mom or dad on Mother's Day or Father's Day. What do you do? You call to say you're sorry, and to tell them you love them. So what about the Lord's Day (Sunday)? If you can't be there in person, do you do the same with God?

If you can't make it to Mass due to a serious reason, talk to Him: watch the Mass livestream, pray the Rosary, read the Sunday readings—or do all of these! Just let Jesus know: "I'm thinking of You, I miss You, and I love You."

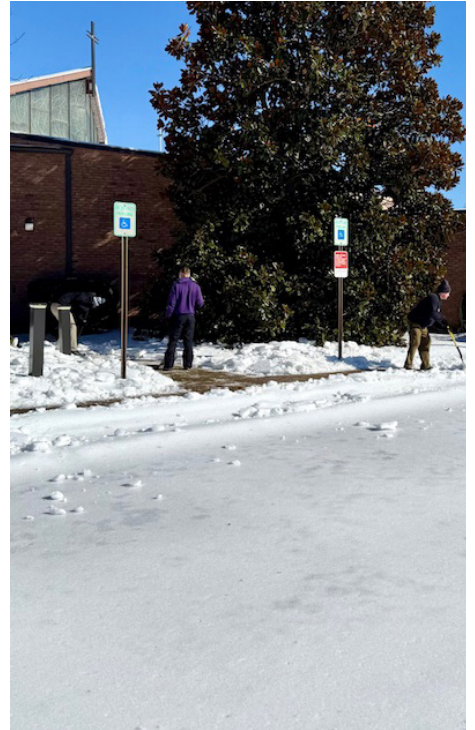

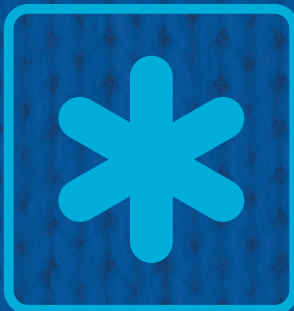

HELPFUL HINTS & REMINDERS

– Did you know that when you write a check, you should use only black or blue ink? All other colors may look very nice, but they don't show up on bank scanners and bank employees have to return the check to us. So please use only black or blue ink when writing a check.

– When you receive your 2025 contribution statement, did you notice that one or more of the collections may have shown only a penny as your contribution. That's because when the envelope was received for posting in our database, no amount was written on the envelope, so a penny was entered to show that an envelope was received but the amount was unknown. Don't forget to write the amount of your contribution on the outside of your contribution envelope.

– If you are using a blank envelope for your contribution, please be sure to print your name, address, date and amount of donation on the envelope, as well as the purpose of the donation. We have had quite a few instances of envelopes being received without any name on it, so the contribution could not be posted.

– From time to time we receive contributions in envelopes from other parishes in the Diocese. If there is no notation, it is our policy to send these contributions to the parish indicated on the envelope. If your contribution is actually meant for St. Mary, please be sure to use St. Mary envelopes, or a plain envelope with your name and address indicated, or cross out the name of the parish on the envelope and clearly write St. Mary on the envelope so that we can process your contribution properly.
