Pope Francis: 5 Fruits of Eucharistic Adoration

Pope Francis always invited us to a more vigorous worship of Our Lord, Jesus!



"The amazement of adoration, the wonder of worship, is something essential in the life of the Church, especially in our own day."

1. The Importance of Adoration For Our Time

One of the phrases that Pope Francis repeated often is that Adoration is essential for our world today and the Church needs to rediscover this practice. He writes: It is my hope that "the Bishops will catechize the faithful about praying through adoration. The Eucharist requires it of us." May we discover anew the sense of wonder and awe at the Lord's great gift of himself and to spend time with him in the celebration of the Holy Mass and in personal prayer and adoration before the Blessed Sacrament.

2. Adoration Helps Us Understand Our Lives Better

The Pope writes: "When one places oneself, docile and humble, before God, often one receives a specific understanding of the meaning of one's own life: to adore is not to waste time, but to make our time a dwelling-place for God."

3. Adoration Is How We Embrace Incarnation

During Francis' homily for the midnight Mass of Christmas in December 2023, the Pope highlighted how adoration allows us to embrace Jesus' incarnation and presence in our lives. "In Bethlehem, as crowds of people were caught up in the excitement of the census, coming and going, a few were close to Jesus: Mary and Joseph, the shepherds, and then the Magi. Let us learn from them. They stood gazing upon Jesus, with their hearts set on him. They did not speak, they worshipped," the Pope said. Let us do as they did, in Bethlehem, a town whose name means 'House of Bread.' Stay tuned, as we explore the Pontiff's final two fruits of Eucharistic Adoration next week!

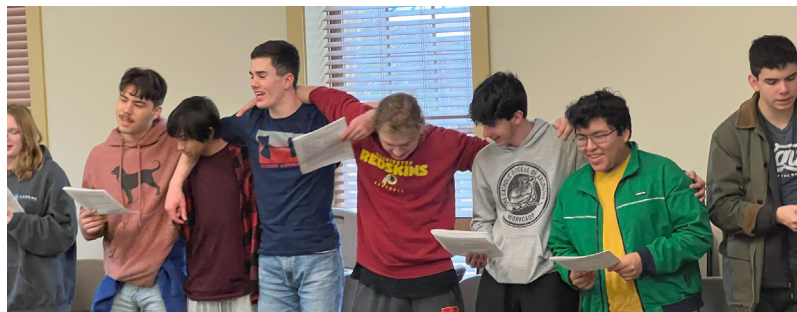

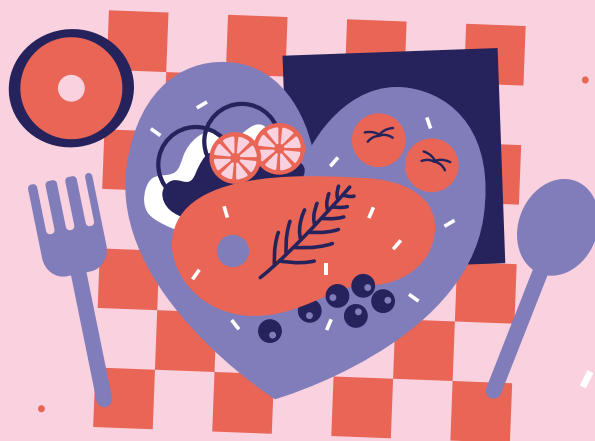

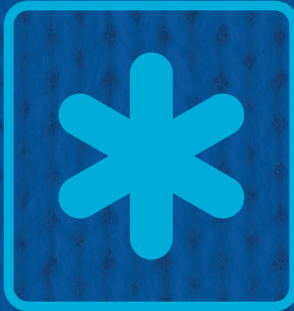

Diocesan Newspaper Collection February 1 & 2

The Parish pays an assessment to the Diocese on 80% of its registered families for subscriptions to the Arlington Catholic Herald. All subscriptions paid to St. Mary during the year and contributions made in the Annual Diocesan Newspaper Collection stay with the parish to help offset this assessment. Last year we received a total of \$11,513.50 from the annual newspaper collection and quarterly subscription envelopes to help offset a \$76,076.00 assessment.

If you have not paid for or renewed your subscription to the Arlington Catholic Herald, we ask that you consider doing so now. The subscription rate of \$24.00 a year is one of the lowest of any Catholic newspaper with a circulation of 117,000, and the wealth of Catholic articles and information about your Diocese is invaluable. Green subscription envelopes are included with the January, April, July and October envelope packets for your convenience, and the Annual Diocesan Newspaper Collection is next weekend. Your generosity is truly appreciated, and we are very grateful for your constant support. God bless you.

First Offering Contributions to Help Offset Cost of Collection Envelopes

Each year in January the envelope packet always includes an envelope marked "First Offering" with a suggested donation of \$15.00. This is not a regular collection, but merely a request for a free-will offering to help offset the cost of the printing and bimonthly mailing of collection envelopes to more than 5,000 parish families. From July 2024 to June 2025, the parish's cost for the offering envelopes was \$30,961.19. First Offering donations received for the same period totaled \$5,185.00. Your generosity and support in helping to offset the cost of the envelopes is greatly appreciated.

Children's Charity - February

The children's charity that will benefit from the offering in February is Hazelwild Farm's Therapeutic Riding Program. The program offers specialized horseback riding lessons for all ages of riders with a wide range of physical, cognitive and emotional disabilities. The lessons increase stability, flexibility, strength, motor skills, cognitive ability and confidence for the riders, along with providing many other physical and emotional benefits.
