

A Sacred New Arrival: The Monstrance

As construction on the Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel progresses, we are blessed to share a first look at the sacred vessel that will sit at its heart: our new monstrance. Its radiant blue gems serve as a prayerful tribute to the Blessed Mother, honoring her maternal presence as she leads us always to her Son.

Understanding the Monstrance

Derived from the Latin monstrare ("to show"), the monstrance is the vessel used to display the Blessed Sacrament for adoration, benediction, and processions.

While early monstrances resembled small towers, the "sunburst" design became prominent in the 16th century. This design symbolizes Christ as the "Sun of Justice," the true Light of the World who outshines all earthly shadows.

Elements of the Monstrance

Every element of the monstrance is crafted with deep theological purpose:

- **Luna (Lunette):** The gilded, crescent-shaped clip that securely holds the Host.
- **Solar /Sunburst:** The radiating rays symbolize the divine glory and light of Christ.
- **Window (Crystal):** The glass pane that protects the Host while allowing the faithful to gaze upon Him.
- **Stem and Knot:** The neck of the vessel, featuring a "knot" for a secure, reverent grip.
- **Base:** The heavy, weighted foot ensures the vessel stands firm upon the altar.
- **Cross:** Surmounting the entire vessel, it signifies the Sacrifice of Calvary.

Dear Folks,

Lent is coming. Are you ready? And I'm not talking about your plans to eat too many pancakes or tacos on Tuesday!

1. Lenten penances and challenges!

I think I use the same penances most years. Why? Because I find that they help me to **“focus”** on my primary faults. Giving up shaving is more of a marker of time than a real penance... but I do find it very penitential to have a beard by the time Lent is drawing to a close. Cutting back or eliminating electronics/screen time is another penance that most even modern Americans should embrace. But as you plan to hit Lent running, don't be afraid to give up the thing you least want to give up! That may be the Lord whispering in your soul to get your attention!

2. “Be still and know that I am God.” Psalm 46:10

Penances are useless without prayer. Yep, useless. How will you deepen your prayer life this Lent, and form habits that will extend into Ordinary Time and eternity? Make a plan, something achievable, and don't despair that you might succeed for three days and fail for two. Three steps forward and two steps back still nets you one forward! Jesus is the master of the patient long game!

3. Bishop's Lenten Appeal.

Thank you for your support of this important appeal each year. Your generosity goes a long way to supporting so many worthy ministries in our diocese. In a time when we are all asking for greater accountability from Church hierarchy, know that this appeal provides direct assistance to many of our brothers and sisters and neighbors. It is not a collection for the bishop personally, but for the many works of charity that are carried out in his and our names!

There you go. Did you notice that those three are the classic prayer, fasting, and almsgiving? Timeless classics of the spiritual life.

And one more expression of gratitude on the almsgiving side: thank you for your generous support of the Souper Bowl Drive. 1,353 total pounds from the parish and school—fantastic! Thank you to all who helped and participated!

Oops, one more: did you see the notice in here for the Lenten Fish Taco Truck and mac-n-cheese? We are trying something different this year on two Lenten Fridays to offer something that might work for families... as we will subsidize the first 500 tacos each of those Fridays.



Brief Micah History

Downtown Fredericksburg congregations have been involved with the community's homeless population since the late 1980s, when we opened our church buildings as shelter space and provided meals to those in need. As that original initiative evolved, many people who lived chronically on the street found themselves ineligible due to unmedicated mental illnesses, disabilities, criminal backgrounds and other barriers. With no other place to access shelter and support, they found themselves literally sleeping on the street and they turned to the local churches for help.

Congregations initially responded through the development of various ministries in their individual churches. But after a community effort to help the original shelter find a permanent location in 2005, the downtown churches coalesced around a new vision for assisting those whose needs were not being met.

'Doing justice, loving kindness and walking humbly with God' as things the Lord requires of us (Micah 6:8), became the foundational values for forming the collaborative effort that the churches call Micah Ecumenical Ministries. To this day, nine downtown congregations claim part of their missional identity in Micah, working together to cultivate community and care for neighbors. As recognition that the body of Christ can always do more together than it can ever do apart, the clergy of these churches guide the organization.



There are 40 men currently studying for the priesthood, who – God willing – will one day serve in our parishes.






