A New Tabernacle for The Saint Helena Chapel

Fashioned with exquisite craftsmanship, this magnificent gold-plated tabernacle is shaped in the traditional manner of a classical ark or mini-basilica. Every surface is adorned with intricate, deeply stylized repoussé and chasing work, featuring ornate spiral acanthus scrolls, rope-textured borders, and delicate geometric patterning that beautifully reflects the sanctuary light.

- **The Front Facade & Door:** The central tabernacle door is set within a deeply recessed, ornamental frame. The door features a striking background embellished with a vibrant diamond-lattice pattern filled with rich red and deep blue enamel, reminiscent of medieval stained-glass windows. At the center is a circular golden medallion depicting the Paschal Lamb symbolically Christ, “the Lamb of God”, who redeemed the world by the shedding of His blood. Flanking the central door are two detailed narrative relief panels: the left captures The Presentation of Our Lord in the Temple, and the right depicts The Flight into Egypt. The entire structure is surmounted by a delicate Greek cross inset with a brilliant blue lapis lazuli cabochon stone at its center.
- **The Left Elevation (The Epiphany):** The exterior of the tabernacle acts as a visual gospel. The left side features a central relief panel of the Three Wise Men (Magi) dressed in regal attire and crowns, kneeling in profound reverence as they offer their symbolic treasures of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. They are flanked on either side by beautifully sculpted, adoring angels standing in prayerful vigil within narrow arched niches.
- **The Right Elevation (The Nativity):** The right side depicts the humble shepherds in the fields, gathered closely together with gazes of wonder and awe as they receive the glad tidings of the Savior's birth. Like the opposite side, this central narrative is framed by two elegant, recessed adoring angels standing in perpetual adoration.
- **The Hidden Sanctuary (The Interior):** When the tabernacle door is opened, it reveals a breathtaking golden interior chamber designed to safely hold the consecrated Host. The inner walls are completely wrapped in a repeating, highly polished hexagonal floral tile motif. Mounted prominently on the back wall is a spectacular, finely detailed relief of The Last Supper. This image of Christ instituting the Holy Eucharist surrounded by His twelve Apostles serves as a powerful reminder that the living presence reserved within this tabernacle is the exact same sacrificial feast.

A Message of Sincere Gratitude “The house of God, where the Eucharistic mystery is celebrated and reserved, should be beautiful and suited to prayer and sacred celebrations...” We extend our deepest, most heartfelt gratitude to the generous donors who have lovingly memorialized the stunning new gold-plated tabernacle for the Saint Helena Chapel. Your beautiful gift ensures that our Lord will be housed in a manner that reflects His supreme majesty, providing a beautiful focal point for silent adoration and community prayer for generations to come. Please keep these donors and their intentions in your prayers. The new tabernacle will be placed in the Saint Helena Chapel by the end of May.

from our pastor

Dear Folks,

Confirmation was a great 24 hours! I was so amazed at the energy and stamina of Archbishop Broglio, for the Archdiocese for Military Services! But should I be surprised by the endless stamina of a military man? Nope! And consider that a small preview of gratitude for the men and women who serve in uniform, as Monday is Memorial Day!

Have a Blessed feast of Pentecost!

The feast of Pentecost is one that should give us great hope and enthusiasm for living the faith in the face of difficulty. One of the titles for the Holy Spirit is the Consoler. What an inspiration to know that God has this nickname which describes He Himself granting us His consolation! This is why it is a work of mercy to console the grieving. Once you walk through the experience of bidding farewell to loved ones, you quickly learn how important are the small words of kindness, encouragement, and consolation. Let us allow our hearts to be formed such that the consolation we receive from Jesus, we can extend to others.

Finally, summer: let me repeat an exhortation that I often give at the beginning of summer regarding vacations, Mass attendance, and dressing properly for Mass.

Summer brings vacation, and that means relaxation for most folks. One of the great benefits of summer is that life slows down significantly for us. I still exhort you to make Sunday Mass the cornerstone of your week. If you need to find a Catholic Church near to your vacation in Toledo, Timbuktu, or even Toronto then check out: MassTimes.org

Summer also brings different wardrobes. I remember as a child that it meant that we would break out the white pants that would

be my “Sunday Clothes” for the summer. Remember those: Sunday Clothes? We each would do well to just pause and examine our consciences about how we dress for Jesus during the summer. The most common argument is that, “Jesus doesn’t care what I wear!” or “God doesn’t need me to dress up!”

We are right to say that God doesn’t need me to dress up... I need me to dress up! However Jesus does care what we wear, but not because He is judging us based on our clothes. He cares what we wear because how we dress is part of our preparation for and participation in Mass! When we take the time and effort to give Jesus our best (clothes, time, attention, and love) He can pour out His blessing into our souls! The concept of “Sunday Clothes” is that I give Jesus my best, because that is what God deserves, the best of me. I recall with great fondness how I would untuck my shirt every Sunday, the very second that I walked out of the Church Door!

Let me also be clear to say that nobody is to be turned away or judged because they are wearing shorts and flip-flops. There are times when we are literally coming from the beach, or on our way to a soccer match, or even sometimes folks can be simply struggling to feel welcome at Mass. I recall a conversation in another parish with a teen who was inappropriately dressed for Mass, where they were actually hoping that I would chastise them so that they could have an excuse not to come back! I know you pray for wisdom as parents, let us also pray for wisdom as a parish family to be gentle with our struggling sheep, but also challenging all to grow deeper in faith every day.

STARE is designed for students with diverse, diagnosed learning or physical disabilities whose spiritual and religious educational needs are not met through traditional Religious Education and SPRED (Special Religious Education) classes.

STARE implements an adapted version of Christ Our Life, the curriculum used by the regular Religious Education program.

STARE also uses tactile, concrete learning tools to prepare students to receive the Sacraments of Initiation on an individualized timetable.
