The Divine Mercy Image: Part 1 The Call to Paint

As we prepare our hearts for the new Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel, we are introducing a three-part series sharing the spiritual and artistic journey behind our chapel's custom Divine Mercy painting. The image was beautifully crafted by William O'Connor, Fine Arts Department Chair at St. John Paul the Great High School, and a parishioner of St. Mary. Below, William shares what it was like to receive this sacred call and how he prepared his heart for the canvas.

"Not in the beauty of the color, nor of the brush is the greatness of this image, but in My grace." — Our Lord to St. Faustina (Diary, 313)

Q: As an art instructor at St. John Paul the Great High School, you spend your days teaching others how to express themselves visually. What was it like stepping away from the teacher's desk to take on such a massive, deeply personal project of your own?

"It was a tremendous blessing! Working with students is a great joy, and observing daily the care that many place in their work to "get things right" inspires me to approach my own work with similar patience, especially for one of this magnitude."

Q: Does teaching art at a Catholic high school influence how you approach sacred art? How did that background shape your vision for this specific painting?

"Sacred art has the specific purpose of aiding the faithful to enter into the Mass, the highest form of liturgical prayer. With regular recourse to the Mass, teaching in a Catholic high school has helped me understand that it's the Mass that makes the art sacred, not the other way around. Additionally, our school's patron, Saint John Paul II, wrote in 1999 a "Letter to Artists" in which he reminds artists of their special vocation to beauty and calls them to make visible the invisible; that is, the life of faith."

Q: When you first heard about the new Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel and asked Father for permission to create the image, what was driving that request? What was on your heart?

"A culmination of several contributing factors led to my asking Father for the commission. Looking back, I believe the Lord had been preparing me in my work as a teacher and an artist to take on this responsibility, and I remember that, at the time, I had a desire to contribute to the parish's capital campaign in a way I believed was possible."

Q: How did you prepare yourself spiritually before putting the first brushstroke on the canvas?

"It was certainly a matter of much prayer. I had placed the entire idea of painting the Divine Mercy Image in Mary's hands, and during those months of prayer prior to receiving Father's permission, I asked Jesus for the commission, only if it were to be accompanied by the corresponding grace to complete the commission as he might like. Otherwise, I preferred not to have received it."

Stay tuned for Part 2 next week, where William will take us inside the studio to discuss the artistic choices, symbolism, and unique challenges of bringing this image of divine love to life.

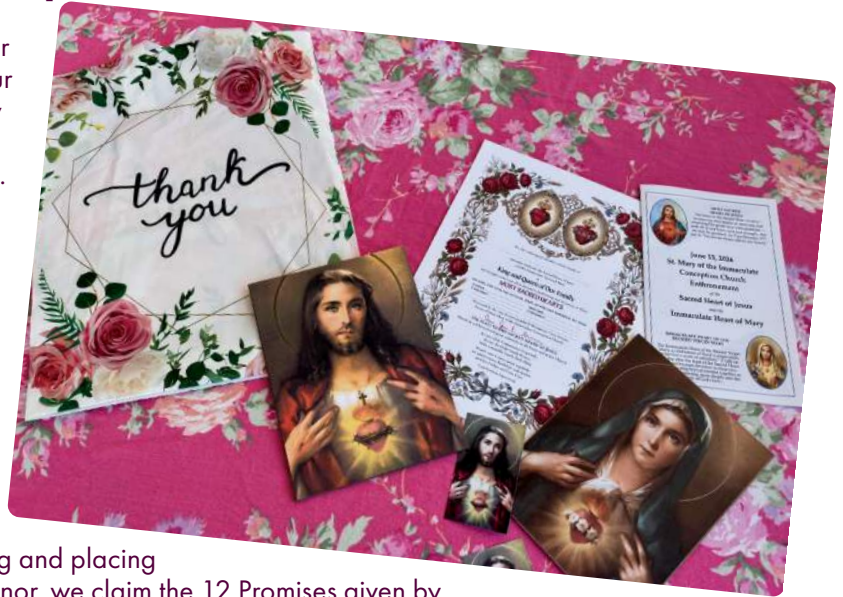
Parish-Wide Home Enthronement Update

A heartfelt thank you to all the faithful who joined us for the Parish-Wide Home Enthronement on June 13th. Our Blessed Mother always desires to lead us more deeply into the heart of her Divine Son, and it is through her maternal intercession that we are guided safely to Him. So it was only fitting that the Legion of Mary hold the Enthronement on the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. We were blessed with a wonderful turnout, as over 60 families gathered to consecrate their homes. Because this is such a beautiful source of grace for our parish families, we look forward to making this an annual ceremony.

For those unfamiliar with this devotion, a Home Enthronement is a sacred tradition in which we formally recognize Jesus Christ as the King and the center of our home and family life. By solemnly blessing and placing an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus in a place of honor, we claim the 12 Promises given by Our Lord to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque for those who honor His Sacred Heart—including His pledge to establish peace in their homes, comfort them in all their afflictions, and shed abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.

When asked for their feedback on the ceremony, a parishioner stated that it was "A beautiful way to honor and welcome the Blessed Mother, and Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, into our hearts and homes."

St. Michael's Lent – Begins August 15

Did you know that many saints observed additional periods of prayer and fasting throughout the year beyond the Lenten season before Easter?

One of these traditions is St. Michael's Lent, a devotional practice closely associated with St. Francis of Assisi. Deeply devoted to St. Michael and the holy angels, St. Francis would retreat to Mount La Verna for forty days of prayer, fasting, and contemplation as he sought to imitate Christ and prepare himself for greater spiritual challenges.

Rich in history and meaning, this Franciscan devotion dates back to the 13th century. Observed from the Feast of the Assumption (August 15) until Michaelmas (September 29), St. Michael's Lent is traditionally regarded as a forty-day period of prayer and penance, following the ancient custom of excluding Sundays from the count. Michaelmas is now celebrated in the Church as the Feast of Saints Michael, Gabriel, and Raphael, Archangels.

Today, this period is commonly known as St. Michael's Lent. Preserved and promoted by the Franciscans over the centuries, the devotion has inspired many of the faithful to honor St. Michael and seek his protection. During St. Michael's Lent in 1224, St. Francis received the extraordinary grace of the Stigmata—the Five Wounds of Christ—while praying on Mount La Verna.

Although not part of the Church's official liturgical calendar, St. Michael's Lent remains a beautiful opportunity to grow closer to Christ through prayer, penance, and devotion.

Children's Charity - July

Children's Offertory Contributions for the month of July will be donated to Families of the Wounded Fund. This fund was created in 2005 to help the families of service members who came to McGuire Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Richmond with traumatic brain injuries and spinal-cord injuries from combat in Iraq and Afghanistan. Former Army Captain William Haneke, a wounded Vietnam Veteran, and some colleagues recognized the need to assist family members who were away from home tending to their loved ones when they saw two young mothers with babies arrive from across the country with no money and barely enough gas to make the trip. The organization gives 100 percent of all tax-deductible donations to the families to help with food, lodging, transportation, child care, diapers and long-distance calling cards during the many weeks a family is in the Central Virginia area while a veteran is being treated.
