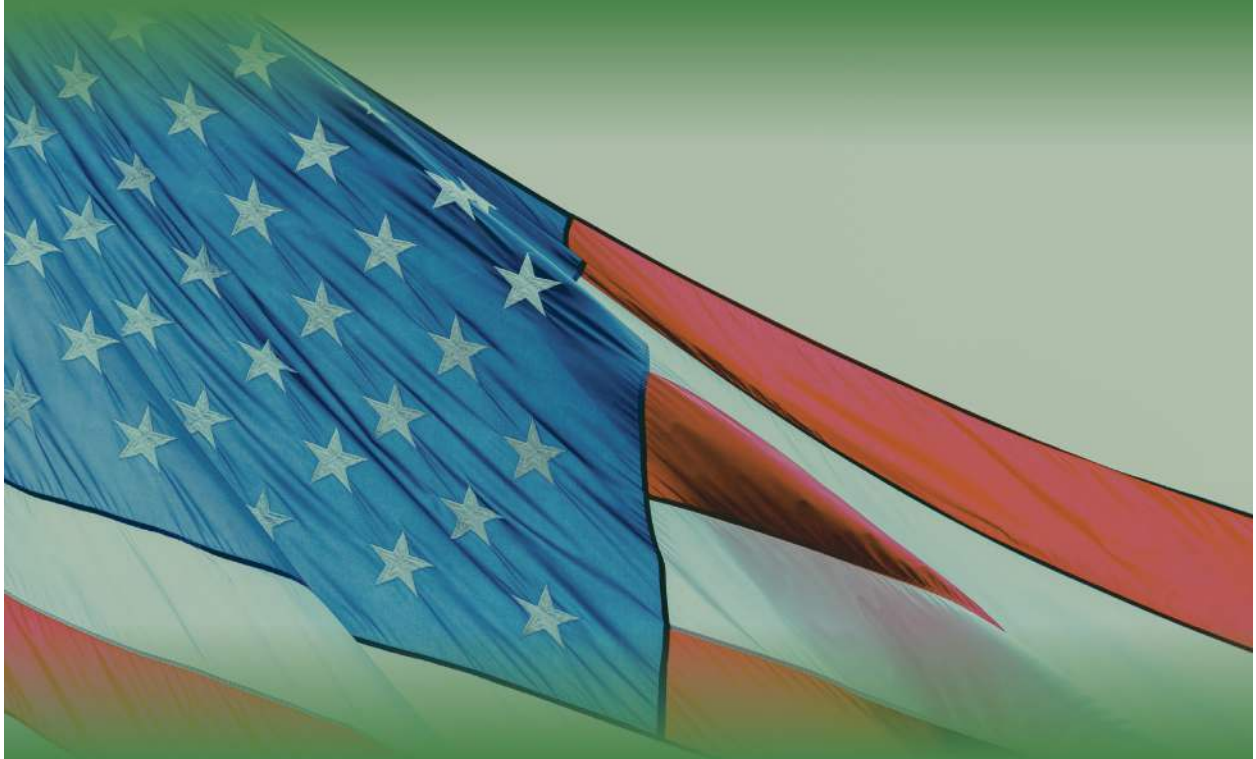

Part 2: The Collaborative & Artistic Process with William O'Connell

Q: Did knowing this artwork was a memorial sponsorship from a fellow parish family add a special sense of meaning to your work?

Yes, most definitely. It added a profound sense of meaning. I was deeply struck by the immense generosity of the sponsoring family. In meeting them, it became beautifully evident that their generosity wasn't just limited to a financial contribution—it was something lived out in every aspect of their family life as a genuine expression of their love.

Q: How did the initial sample paintings and feedback from Father and the family help shape the final look of the image?

Three smaller studies were painted prior to our first meeting to help facilitate discussions about the critical elements within the Divine Mercy image. Having those visual aids present was incredibly helpful; it gave everyone a concrete reference point to say things like, "strengthen this area," "make this brighter," or "soften this area." (photo of one of the studies included)

A couple of months later, I presented a fourth, larger study. This final study incorporated every suggestion from our initial meeting, which helped everyone truly visualize what the final painting could become. These collaborative sessions proved invaluable for gaining insight into what was most important for the St. Mary's community to emphasize in the piece.

Q: How did seeing the painting in situ under the chapel's specific lighting inspire your final brush strokes compared to working in your studio?

Seeing the painting in its intended final setting is essential for evaluating whether the work truly lives up to its purpose. The chapel offers a sense of size, scope, and lighting that my studio simply doesn't have. Being in the space allowed me to see specific areas that needed adjustments in color or intensity so the image could be "read" by the viewer exactly as intended. Furthermore, working with the committee provided a crucial "fresh set of eyes." They helped me identify areas of the work that I had grown accustomed to over long hours in the studio.

Q: What technical and engineering puzzles did you have to solve to align the artwork with the chapel's architecture and liturgy?

Installing the altarpiece required immense pre-planning. Because the monstrance is the central focus, the placement of Christ's figure and the trajectory of the rays were precisely designed to complement our Eucharistic Lord. The biggest challenge, however, was physical installation—especially with the carpentry workshop and my studio located 1,700 miles apart. The builders made cuts in the crown molding so the painting could slide in from below, but because the reredos sits directly on the altar, there effectively was no "from below" space to work with.

Our collaborative solution required some unique engineering: we had to design a canvas frame that could fold at a 90-degree angle. This allowed it to slip under the crown molding while safely clearing the altar. Another talented parishioner, Joe Wilkinson, custom-built the stretcher bars with that specialized hinge system—and the rest is history.

Summer Camp

Our first week of Summer Camp has been filled with excitement, discovery, and hands-on learning.

In Kids Detective Academy, campers worked on the case of the Missing Masterpiece. Students learned how investigators approach a crime scene and the steps involved in forming a theory of the case. They explored fingerprint analysis, handwriting comparison, and paper chromatography, and used microscopes to examine hair and fiber samples. The week concluded with pH experiments to test unknown liquids. Campers successfully solved the case and discovered an important truth: in science, curiosity and a willingness to adjust your perspective when new information appears are essential.

In Mission Control Coding Camp, students learned how to code for the Astrobee robots aboard the International Space Station. They participated in the Galactic Greenhouse Challenge, exploring astrobotany and the goals of the Artemis missions. Using block coding, campers programmed their robots to garden aboard the ISS and then competed to see whose strategy earned the most points. Along the way, they learned foundational coding concepts such as logic, functions, variables, arrays, and more.

Join us this summer for the Zero Robotics Middle School Challenge!

Zero Robotics is a program designed in collaboration between MIT, NASA, the International Space Station (ISS), Aerospace, and other sponsors. The students will learn coding through Google's block program (which is the actual code that can operate the robots). If your child is familiar with MIT Scratch coding, this is very similar, as it uses blocks to create the code.

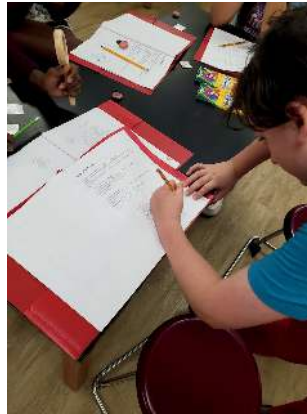

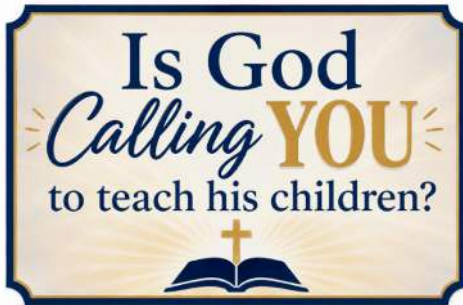

Dear St. Mary Family,



I want to take a moment to express my deepest gratitude for your incredible support of our Big Board Fundraiser and for making WorkCamp possible. Through the generosity of our parish family, our teens and adult leaders served approximately **106 residents**, helping to make their homes warmer, safer, and drier. This ministry is also a testament to the generous hearts of our teens. There are many summer camps they could choose to attend, camps filled with rafting, zip-lining, and exciting adventures. Yet, year after year, they choose WorkCamp. They choose to spend a week serving others, sacrificing their comforts, and giving of themselves for people they have never met.

The heart of WorkCamp is beautifully captured in **Acts 2:42-47**: *"They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers..."*

WorkCamp is built upon these very pillars: **prayer, fellowship, community, and service**. For one week, nearly 1,200 people live in a Christian community; praying together, celebrating Mass each morning, and after being nourished by the Body of Christ, we are sent forth to be His hands and feet in the world. Living in community with 1,200 people certainly comes with its challenges; we learn to share our space, our schedules, and often our comforts. Our teens even give up their cell phones for the week! In the eyes of the world, it may not make much sense to raise money to spend a week working for free, repairing homes, and sacrificing many of the conveniences we enjoy every day.

And yet, this is where miracles happen.

One of the homeowners we served this year was a veteran. His wife shared that they had reached out to several veteran organizations seeking help to install a wheelchair ramp, but no one had been able to assist them until the Diocese said yes. As she spoke, her husband sat nearby, visibly emotional and overcome with gratitude for what had been done for their family. Moments like these remind us that service changes lives, not only for those we serve, but also for those who serve.

None of this beautiful work would be possible without the extraordinary generosity of our adult leaders. They willingly give up a week of vacation time to make WorkCamp happen. Some serve as contractors, others as crew leaders, but each one offers their time, talents, and love so generously. I stand in awe of their sacrifice and dedication.

Watching our adults and teens come together is a beautiful reflection of the Church itself: many people with different gifts, united as one Body in Christ, serving a common mission.

To our crew leaders, contractors, and homebase (Katya, Keiry, Jay D., Peter, Paul, Jim, Jonathan, Jay B., Anthony, Greg, Bill, Gus, Peter D., Rick, Kirk, Mike, Brian, Sam, Greg F., Felix, John, Jack, Steven, Leo, Jim B., Brian), Thank You! You are truly a gift to our parish and to our young people.



And to our entire St. Mary family: thank you for believing in this mission, for investing in our teens, and for making this life-changing week possible through your prayers and generosity. If you have made it this far, I ask one final favor: please pray a Hail Mary for all of the teens and adult leaders who served at WorkCamp this year, and for the families whose lives were touched by their love and sacrifice.



Children's Charity - July

Children's Offertory Contributions for the month of July will be donated to Families of the Wounded Fund. This fund was created in 2005 to help the families of service members who came to McGuire Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Richmond with traumatic brain injuries and spinal-cord injuries from combat in Iraq and Afghanistan. Former Army Captain William Haneke, a wounded Vietnam Veteran, and some colleagues recognized the need to assist family members who were away from home tending to their loved ones when they saw two young mothers with babies arrive from across the country with no money and barely enough gas to make the trip. The organization gives 100 percent of all tax-deductible donations to the families to help with food, lodging, transportation, child care, diapers and long-distance calling cards during the many weeks a family is in the Central Virginia area while a veteran is being treated.
