Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel: A Window into Grace St. Bernadette & Our Lady of Lourdes

As you step into our new Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel, each of our custom stained glass windows invites us to meditate on a unique aspect of our faith. Today, we highlight the window that beautifully connects the story of Lourdes, Eucharistic mercy, and our own parish family..."

This window was intentionally chosen to bridge the spiritual heart of our parish, St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception, with the extraordinary grace of Our Lady's apparitions at Lourdes and the healing gift of Divine Mercy.

The Apparition at Lourdes

In 1858, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared eighteen times to a humble young girl, St. Bernadette Soubirous, in a grotto in Lourdes, France. When Bernadette asked her name, Mary revealed her identity with the words inscribed at the base of our window: "I Am the Immaculate Conception."

Our Parish Identity

That profound title connects our chapel directly to our patroness and our parish family at St. Mary's. It serves as a visual reminder of Our Lady's maternal care, guiding us directly to her Son.

Divine Mercy & Eucharistic Grace

Positioned above Our Lady and St. Bernadette are the Monstrance bearing the Blessed Sacrament and the Lamb of God (Agnus Dei) atop the Book of Seven Seals. St. Bernadette once wrote, "The Eucharist bathes the tormented soul in light and love." Just as a miraculous spring of healing burst forth at Lourdes, the infinite light and stream of Divine Mercy flow to us through Christ's real presence in the Holy Eucharist.

By uniting the miracle of Lourdes, our parish's Marian patronage, and the Eucharistic Lamb, this window invites us to bring our own prayers, burdens, and search for healing to the merciful Heart of Jesus.

May this sacred artwork inspire your Holy hours of prayer every time you visit the Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel.

Dear Folks,

Ballot Initiatives and Parish Life Weekend.

First, the unnecessary and extreme ballot initiatives that will be brought before all voters this fall. The bishop has instructed that his letter be read at all Masses this weekend. And it is reprinted in today's bulletin. Please prayerful read and act.

In 30 years of preaching, I do not recall ever being asked to read a letter on ballot initiatives from the bishop at all Masses.

Note that I am carefully saying, ballot initiatives, and not election. These votes are not about your favorite political party seizing the reigns of power, but they are about the most pressing and coercive intrusion of the law into the heart of the family: marriage and the protection of children.

On matters of faith and morals, the Church must not lose her voice. And we must not let others cower us into silence. In twenty years of being a pastor, most election cycles, I have receive threats attempting to silence the pro-life witness of the Church. I expect the same with more venom this year.

I also know that some will be energized by the voice of the bishop and pastor to do the exact opposite. Our choices do matter. Our voices matter. "If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." - Psalm 95:8

In the last several years, most pro-life ballot initiatives have failed. Why? Because when the law changed pushing these onto state ballots, hearts did not change. This year's ballot initiatives veil extreme positions behind pleasant language.

If you struggle accepting the moral teaching of the Lord, recall how Pope Francis was fond of saying that "the Church is a field hospital for sinners." Recall the Lord dining with the outcasts and excommunicated of the day, and doing so in order to draw them home to Himself by a path of mercy, and forgiveness.

"If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts." - Psalm 95:8

Next week is our Parish Life Weekend. Another case of 'what can Jesus do with my talents?' This parish is big, and is able to accomplish so much, because each parishioner who shares their talents finds them multiplied by the Lord and combined with the gifts of others, no one need bear to great a share.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

All of us in the Commonwealth of Virginia will soon face very serious legal threats to the sacredness of human life and the sanctity of marriage. During the upcoming election season, from September the 18th to November the 3rd, two dangerous ballot initiatives will be brought before all voters.

One amendment, which will appear as Ballot Question 1, proposes an extreme and vague change to the Virginia Constitution that would create a legal right to unregulated abortions, performed by unlicensed abortion practitioners at any time during pregnancy. This threatens the health and safety of mothers and would allow for abortions targeting healthy babies all the way up to birth. The amendment extends this so-called right even to minors. It would remove the role of parents concerning life-altering and irreversible decisions for their minor daughters. Unfortunately, abortion is already legal in Virginia. But what is on the ballot this fall would expand abortion beyond what most citizens recognize as reasonable limits. The proposed amendment is extreme. It is unnecessary. And it is wrong.

Another amendment, which will appear as Ballot Question 2, would remove from our state constitution the truth, as Jesus taught, that marriage is between one man and one woman. It would also enshrine gender ideology by falsely separating the reality of one's sex and gender, obscuring the truth that we are created in the image and likeness of God.

Yet, with God's grace, there is always hope! "We the people" can unite to defeat these dangerous amendments to our Commonwealth's constitution.

The Church is not partisan. The Church never advocates for or against specific candidates or parties. At the same time, the Church, in fidelity to the Gospel and her mission, always speaks clearly, faithfully, and truthfully concerning matters of faith and morals in public life. An issue of fundamental moral justice confronts each one of us. The Church boldly proclaims its "Yes!" to the protection of the unborn and the sanctity of all human life. For us to speak this Yes, we must together proclaim "no!" to these radically unjust ballot initiatives, in fidelity to God and for the good of all in our society. I ask you, then, to do three things.

First, I ask you to be a faithful disciple and pledge to vote by visiting CatholicsVoteNo.com, where you can learn more and share the truth about these extreme ballot initiatives.

Second, I ask that you ensure you are registered to vote and make a plan to get to the polls, starting as early as this coming Friday, September the 18, when early voting begins. I urge you to vote early to ensure nothing prevents you from casting your ballot in this critical election.

Third, I ask that you speak with family, friends, and colleagues, in truth and love, with a focus on activating and turning out those most likely to vote to protect life and the truth about marriage.

Our baptismal promises call us to fulfill our sacred duty to participate in public life with a prayerfully and factually informed conscience. CatholicsVoteNo.com equips you with the information and resources you will need as you cast your ballot.

Together, with God's grace, we can protect life, liberty, and the future of our Virginia home. Through the intercession of Mary our Mother, may our Lord Jesus bless, inspire, and guide you always.

de nuestro obispo los católicos votan

Septiembre de 2026

Queridos hermanos y hermanas en Cristo:

Pronto todos enfrentaremos, en la Mancomunidad de Virginia, graves amenazas legales contra la sacralidad de la vida humana y la santidad del matrimonio. Durante la próxima temporada electoral, del 18 de septiembre al 3 de noviembre, se presentarán ante los votantes dos peligrosas iniciativas en la boleta.

Una enmienda, que aparecerá como la Pregunta 1 en la boleta, propone un cambio extremo y ambiguo a la Constitución de Virginia que crearía un derecho legal al aborto sin regulación, practicado por proveedores sin licencia y en cualquier momento del embarazo. Esto pondría en peligro la salud y la seguridad de las madres y permitiría abortos contra bebés sanos hasta el momento mismo del nacimiento. La enmienda extendería este llamado “derecho” incluso a las menores de edad, eliminando el papel de los padres en decisiones irreversibles que pueden cambiar la vida de sus hijas. Lamentablemente, el aborto ya es legal en Virginia. Sin embargo, lo que aparecerá en la boleta este otoño ampliaría el aborto más allá de lo que la mayoría de los ciudadanos considera límites razonables. La enmienda propuesta es extrema. Es innecesaria. Y es incorrecta.

Otra enmienda, que aparecerá como la Pregunta 2 en la boleta, eliminaría de nuestra Constitución estatal la verdad, enseñada por Jesús, de que el matrimonio es entre un hombre y una mujer. También consagraría la ideología de género al separar falsamente las realidades del sexo y del género, oscureciendo la verdad de que somos creados a imagen y semejanza de Dios.

Sin embargo, con la gracia de Dios, ¡siempre hay esperanza! “Nosotros, el pueblo” podemos unirnos para derrotar estas peligrosas enmiendas a la Constitución de nuestra Mancomunidad.

La Iglesia no es partidista. La Iglesia nunca aboga a favor ni en contra de candidatos o partidos políticos específicos. Al mismo tiempo, en fidelidad al Evangelio y a su misión, la Iglesia siempre habla con claridad, fidelidad y verdad sobre cuestiones de fe y moral en la vida pública. Cada uno de nosotros se encuentra ante una cuestión fundamental de justicia moral. La Iglesia proclama con valentía su “¡Sí!” a la protección de los no nacidos y a la santidad de toda vida humana. Para pronunciar este “Sí”, debemos proclamar juntos un “¡No!” a estas iniciativas radicalmente injustas en la boleta, en fidelidad a Dios y por el bien de todos en nuestra sociedad. Por ello, les pido que hagan tres cosas.

Primero, les pido que sean discípulos fieles y se comprometan a votar visitando CatholicsVoteNo.com, donde podrán informarse mejor y compartir la verdad sobre estas iniciativas extremas en la boleta.

Segundo, les pido que se aseguren de estar registrados para votar y que hagan un plan para acudir a las urnas a partir de este próximo viernes, 18 de septiembre, cuando comienza la votación anticipada. Los exhorto a votar temprano para que nada les impida emitir su voto en esta elección tan importante.

Tercero, les pido que hablen con sus familiares, amigos y colegas, siempre en la verdad y en el amor, con el propósito de animar y motivar a quienes estén dispuestos a votar para proteger la vida y la verdad sobre el matrimonio.

In just over a month, Virginians will vote on Ballot Question 1, the proposed "Reproductive Freedom" amendment, with early voting beginning September 18. VSHL opposes the amendment, arguing that its language could threaten parental-consent protections, remove requirements that abortions be provided only by licensed medical professionals, limit future protections for babies who survive abortions, and restrict lawmakers' ability to regulate abortion-related conduct. Supporters dispute these concerns, but VSHL maintains that the amendment goes far beyond protecting reproductive care and could permanently expand abortion rights in Virginia. This November is the final step: the amendment will become part of Virginia's Constitution if approved by voters. VSHL and other organizations are working across the Commonwealth to educate voters about what they believe are the amendment's risks and misleading ballot language. A NO vote would leave Virginia's current abortion laws unchanged while preserving the General Assembly's ability to address these issues in the future. Vote NO on Ballot Question 1.

Children's Charity for September

Children's Offertory Contributions for the month of September will be donated to Stafford Junction. In 2002, the Stafford County Sheriff's Department assessed the Olde Forge community, which was known for its high crime

rate. The evaluation identified several challenges such as poverty, domestic violence, substance abuse, unsupervised children, and the arrival of non-English speaking and refugee families. In response, the Sheriff's Department launched a call for action that led to the establishment of Stafford Junction, a non-profit organization with a faith-based approach focused on enhancing the well-being of children and families in low-income regions of Stafford County. Stafford Junction's programs prioritize education, nutrition, and healthy living. Its goal is to improve the lives of those living in low-resource areas by providing them with a path to a better future. For more information, visit their website at staffordjunction.org. What is a Life Chain?

The first Life Chain, born through prayer, was built in 1987 by Please Let Me Live, a small pro-life ministry in Yuba City, California. From its small beginning, the Life Chain has grown to over 1,800 Life Chains in the United States and Canada, and is a call to the Christian Church to mobilize against an abortion holocaust that has claimed over 65 million lives worldwide, through surgical abortion. The Life Chain is a peaceful, prayerful, silent demonstration. Hundreds of Christians – clergy and lay people -- stand 25 to 50 feet apart to form a prayer chain and hold signs reading Abortion Kills Children, Jesus Forgives and Heals, Adoption: The Loving Option, Lord, Forgive Us and Our Nation, Life: The First Inalienable Right. This powerful, visual impact not only raises community awareness but has also been credited with saving children's lives. Consider the words of Pope Saint John Paul II who said, "When life before birth is attacked, we will stand up. No one ever has the authority to destroy unborn human life."

St. Mary Parish will again participate in the Annual Life Chain on Sunday, October 4 and welcomes all our parishioners and local churches as well. We will meet in front of the Parish Life Center at 1:45pm to pick up our signs and walk up to Emancipation Highway (Route 1), where we will form a chain along Route 1 from Stafford Avenue to College Avenue. Please join us and take a stand for the unborn.
